Background

Independent Auxiliary Storage Pools (IASPs) were first introduced in OS/400 V5R1. In that release only a User Defined File System (UDFS) could be located in an IASP. For OS/400 V5R2, the list of object types supported in an IASP has increased and now includes libraries and most types of objects located in them.

Support for libraries raised the possibility that a complete (or almost complete) Content Manager for iSeries (CM) environment could be placed in an IASP. This would allow a CM environment to be switched between systems, or left off-line until needed.

Two types of objects used by CM are not allowed in an IASP, user profiles, and output queues. Any of these objects used by CM would have to be duplicated on both systems.

CM also uses job descriptions, which are allowed in an IASP but should not be placed there. The job description specified in a user profile, or on the SBMJOB command, is required to be available when the job starts. Objects located in an IASP are not available until the job starts and the ASP Group is assigned. Any job descriptions used by CM should be located in the system ASP and would have to be duplicated on both systems.

Assumptions

The following assumptions are made in this document:

- 1. The Content Manager for iSeries V5R1 software is already installed, including all PTFs.
- 2. The IASP has already been created and varied on. In our example the IASP is named IASP201.

Basic Steps

The basic steps to using an IASP with CM for iSeries V5R1 running under OS/400 V5R2 are:

- Run EKDPOST
- 2. Move jobd and outq to another library
- 3. Change jobd to use IASP
- 4. Change user profile to use moved jobd and outq
- 5. Save library to save file
- Delete library
- 7. Restore library to IASP
- 8. Create the User Defined File Space
- 9. Create the directory
- 10. Mount the directory over the User Defined File System
- 11. Create the object directory in CM
- 12. Update your startup programs

Detailed Directions

Detailed direction for each step are:

1. Run the EKDPOST command to create the CM environment library. In our example the library is named QUSRVI.

```
EKDPOST INSTALLT(1) ENVTYPE(2) TOFILLIB(QUSRVI) PREFIX(QVI)
```

2. Move the environment job description and output queue to another library in the system ASP. This is required because output queues are not allowed in an IASP, and the job description is needed at job start time, before the ASP Group has been set.

```
MOVOBJ OBJ(QUSRVI/QVIOUTQ) OBJTYPE(*OUTQ) TOLIB(QUSRSYS)
MOVOBJ OBJ(QUSRVI/QVIJOBD) OBJTYPE(*JOBD) TOLIB(QUSRSYS)
```

3. Change job description to use the IASP.

```
CHGJOBD JOBD(QUSRSYS/QVIJOBD) INLASPGRP(IASP201)
```

4. Change the administrator user profile to use the moved job description and out put queue. Other user profiles created for this CM environment should also be changed.

```
CHGUSRPRF USRPRF(QVIADMIN) JOBD(QUSRSYS/QVIJOBD)
OUTQ(QUSRSYS/QVIOUTQ)
```

5. Save the environment library to a save file.

```
CRTSAVF QGPL/QVISAVF
SAVLIB LIB(QUSRVI) DEV(*SAVF) SAVF(QGPL/QVISAVF)
```

6. Delete the environment library.

```
DLTLIB QUSRVI
```

7. Restore the environment library to the IASP

```
RSTLIB SAVLIB(QUSRVI) DEV(*SAVF) SAVF(QVISAVF) RSTASPDEV(IASP201)
```

8. Create the User Defined File System for this environment

```
CRTUDFS UDFS('/dev/IASP201/QUSRVI.udfs')
```

9. Create the directory for this environment (the directory can have any name but the name must be 8 characters long)

```
MD DIR(VIQUSRVI)
```

10. Mount the User Defined File System over the directory.

```
MOUNT TYPE(*UDFS) MFS('/dev/IASP201/QUSRVI.udfs')
MNTOVRDIR(VIQUSRVI) OPTIONS('rw')
```

11. Create the object directory in CM.

12. If your goal to is isolate a CM environment in an IASP while always having it available for use, you should update your system startup program to vary on the IASP and mount the UDFS every time the system is IPLed. However, if your goal is to reduce IPL time and keep the CM environment off-line until needed, then you do not have to make any changes to your system startup program.

Possible Problems

Some possible problems you might encounter when using CM with an IASP.

Problem	Cause	Solution
You get messages CPF3773 and CPD3828 when restoring library QUSRVI into an IASP.	You did not move output queue QVIOUTQ to another library.	Create the output queue in the system ASP.
You can sign on with user profile QVIADMIN but you get error message CPF9801 when trying to use menu options 1, 2, or 3.	You did not move job description QVIJOBD to another library.	Move the job description to a library in the system ASP.
You can sign on with user profile QVIADMIN but receive error message CPD0170 when trying to use menu option 90.	You did not move job description QVIJOBD to another library.	Signoff using the command SIGNOFF, then move the job description to a library in the system ASP.
You attempt to sign on with user profile QVIADMIN but receive error message CPF1113.	The IASP is varied off.	Vary on the IASP.
You attempt to start the prestart jobs for communication with the client but the jobs end immediately and the joblog contains error message CPFB8E9 ASP group IASP201 not set for thread X'xxxxxxxxxx.	The IASP is varied off.	Vary on the IASP.
You can logon to the CM Client but attempting to view a documents results in error message FRN4214W An error occurred in loading the file. The system cannot display it.	The UDFS is not mounted.	Mount the UDFS over the directory.
You can logon to the CM Client but attempting to import an image file results in error message FRN6912A The system could not create a document object. The server job may contain the error message Duplicate key not allowed for file EKD0880.	The UDFS is not mounted.	Mount the UDFS over the directory.
