Competition format and rules

As of 24 August 2012

Competition

The goalball competition at the London 2012 Paralympic Games will be held from Thursday 30 August to Friday 7 September 2012 at the Copper Box in the Olympic Park.

The competition will consist of one 12-team tournament for men and one 10-team tournament for women.

A total 132 athletes, 72 men and 60 women, may take part in the goalball competition, with each team limited to a maximum of six athletes.

Rules

The goalball competition will be held in accordance with the IBSA Goalball Rules of the Game 2010–2013 available at www.ibsa.es, and the IPC Handbook and Paralympic Charter available at www.paralympic.org.

IBSA, working with LOCOG goalball competition management, will be responsible for the technical control and direction of the goalball competition at the London 2012 Paralympic Games.

Duration

In accordance with IBSA rules, games will be played over two 12-minute halves separated by a three-minute half-time break.

If the scores are tied at the end of the match during the quarterfinal, semifinal and final stages of the competition, there will be a break of three minutes and teams will then play overtime, which will consist of two halves of three minutes.

If the scores remain tied after overtime, the match will be determined by extra throws. There will be no overtime or extra throws during the group phase of the competition.

Competition format

The men's and women's events will consist of a round-robin phase followed by a direct elimination phase.

The men's tournament will begin with two groups of six teams playing in a round-robin format, with each team playing the other five teams in its group once.

The top four teams in each group will qualify for the quarterfinal phase, with the bottom two teams ranked in ninth to 12th place according to the sport's rules.

The winners of the four quarterfinals will progress to the semifinals, and the losers will be ranked in fifth to eighth place according to the sport's rules.

The winners of the semifinals will play in the gold medal match, and the losing teams in the bronze medal match.

The women's tournament will begin with two groups of five teams playing in a round-robin format, with each team playing the other four teams in its group once.

The top four teams in each group will qualify for the quarterfinal phase, with the bottom teams from each group ranked in ninth and 10th place according to sport's rules.

The winners of the four quarterfinals will progress to the semifinals, and the losers ranked in fifth to eighth place according to sport's rules.

The winners of the semifinals will then play in the gold medal match, and the losing teams in the bronze medal match.

Competition draw

The draw was conducted by officials from IBSA in April 2012. The medallists from the previous world championships and the host country were allocated to the respective pools as per IBSA Draw Regulations and the rest of the slots were drawn from the remaining qualified countries.

The venue

The goalball competition at the London 2012 Paralympic Games will be held at the Copper Box.

For the goalball competition, the venue will have a gross capacity of 7,000 spectators.

The field of play for the goalball competition will consist of one 18mx9m competition court. The court and all equipment will be presented in accordance with IBSA rules.

Classification

The purpose of the Paralympic sport classification system is to minimise the impact of impairment on the outcome of competition, so that the athletes who succeed in competition are those with the best anthropometry, physiology and psychology and who have enhanced them to best effect through hard training and quality coaching.

Responsibilities of the NPCs

It is the collective responsibility of each athlete and their NPC, through the chef de mission and the relevant team officials, to be informed about and comply with all classification policies and procedures relating to the London 2012 Paralympic Games and each IPSF's classification rules.

Each NPC is also responsible for ensuring that international classification resulting in a sport class status of 'Review' or 'Confirmed' is obtained for all athletes who are intending to participate in the London 2012 Paralympic Games.

For the first time at a summer Paralympic Games, an online entries system will be used by NPCs to enter their athletes. The system will be pre-populated with sport class and sport class status information from the Classification Master Lists (CML) that will be provided by IPSFs and will cover each athlete submitted for accreditation to the Paralympic Games. The online entries system will be opened to NPCs on 1 July 2012. NPCs are encouraged to do their utmost to ensure their athletes are classified before 15 June 2012.

The CML will include all available information on the class and class status of all athletes who are intending to compete at the London 2012 Paralympic Games.

The NPCs are responsible for verifying the classification status of their athletes before their Delegation Registration Meeting (DRM) in London, on the basis of the CML published by the relevant IPSF.

Classification procedures

The London 2012 Paralympic Games Classification Guide outlines the detailed classification policies and procedures that will apply during the London 2012 Paralympic Games.

Differences from the Olympic Games

Goalball is an exclusively Paralympic sport.

Changes since the Beijing 2008 Paralympic Games

The women's tournament for London 2012 will be contested by 10 teams; in Beijing in 2008 there were eight.

All classification games have been eliminated from the men's and women's schedule.

Game halves are of 12 minutes' duration, not 10.

Korea and Canada face elimination from men's goalball tournament

LONDON, 2 September - The four quarterfinalists from men's goalball group B will be decided on Monday at the Copper Box with Korea and Canada facing elimination from the London 2012 Paralympic Games.

Men's competition

Bottom of the group with three points, Korea need to beat a tough Belgium side, who are already through to the quarterfinals, to qualify. They not only need to win by a significant margin to improve their minus-seven goal difference but must hope that Canada and Algeria lose.

Canada have an even harder task because they require victory over world champions China to have a hope of qualifying, but they too need their nearest rivals Korea and Algeria to lose.

Despite already qualifying, Iran will go for the win against Algeria to top the group and have an easier passage in the quarterfinals.

With six points, Algeria are in a relatively safe position but will also want a result against Iran to be sure of a place in the last eight.

Women's competition

Denmark are bottom of group C having lost both their opening matches and will find it difficult to improve that tally on Monday against China, who are yet to drop a point in the competition.

Brazil play their last group match against Finland but are not yet certain of qualification with the three points they already have on the board.

In group D Australia have yet to claim a point and will try to get their campaign back on track against the defending women's Paralympic champions USA, who lost to Japan on Saturday.

Japan have already qualified for the quarterfinals but will try to win the group by beating Canada.

Copper Box – media information

Usage at London 2012:

Paralympic Games: goalball

Olympic Games: handball, modern pentathlon (for fencing)

Venue Media Centre: *a dedicated working space for the media at each venue*

VMC opening date: 29 August 2012

Opening hours on competition days: two hours before competition until two hours after competition

Opening hours on non-competition days: 09:00 to 18:00

Working spaces: 60

Tribunes: *the area in the seating bowl from where media watch the action*

Tabled seats: 50

Mixed Zone: *media may request interviews with athletes as they exit the field of play through the Mixed Zone. Athletes must pass through the Mixed Zone but are not obliged to speak*

Location: the Mixed Zone is located just off the field of play in an area under the seating bowl

Photographers' positions: *a number of dedicated positions have been secured for photographers*

Designated positions: 60

Results service: *all results and live scoring are available on the Info⁺ system*

Info⁺: five fixed terminals in the Venue Media Centre workroom

myInfo⁺: myInfo⁺ is available via internet connection to those who have subscribed, with all schedules, results, start lists, flash quotes, transport information and more available on the user's own PC

Results delivery: a full results service will be available on all competition days and will be delivered to tribunes, as well as to pigeonholes in the Venue Media Centre. Selected outputs will also be available at the Main Press Centre at the Olympic Park

Media Conference Room: *there will be dedicated media conferences with the captains or notable players and coaches*

Capacity: 50

Frequency: scheduled to take place after every match

Internet: wireless internet in Media Conference Rooms is included as part of the internet package, which is purchased through the rate card

Language services: consecutive translation from athlete language into English will be provided
