# on videos depicting animal cruelt

The court's 8-1 ruling overturns a law enacted in 1999 that banned the of "depictions cruelty," including "conduct in which animal is intentionally living mutilated, wounded or killed." Reactions to the ruling were mixed. A group called the Media Coalition supported the ruling, saying that "If the court were to rewrite the First Amendment every time an unpopular or distasteful subject was at issue, we wouldn't have any free speech left." The US Humane Society called for a new law to be written by Congress, this one more narrow in The society's president, Wayne Pacelle, said that "Congress should act swiftly to make sure the First Amendment is not used as a shield for those committing barbaric acts of cruelty, and then peddling their videos on the Internet."
