Error in a Chart.—Captain Allen, late of the schooner Maipira Packet, lost of Cape St. Roque, with a view of preventing as far as possible a similar error, has published in the N. Y. Messenger a statement of which the following is a copy: "The Maipira Packet crossed the equator in longitude 25 50. May 20th, the island Fernando Noronha was seen westwardly of us, proving an error in the chronometer of over 3 degrees, putting me about six or seven miles from the island. In the neighborhood of the island moderate and calm weather obstructed the vessel to a certain westerly current, causing her to fall to leeward of her position 90 miles lat. 20th May, land was seen W. S. W. and W. 20 miles, by obs. 25 4, S. Stood in and at the distance of 10 miles, from land,
