GOVERNOR, S. B. DAWSON.

The earliest mail brings New York paper of the 3d Inst., Baltimore and Washington of the 2d, and Charleston of the 2d ultimo.

By the packet ship *Charlemagne*, for the safety of which much doubt had been entertained, the 27th York papers have received London's paper of the 27th, via Plymouth, info which harbor the *Charlemagne* had been driven, by stress of weather, on her transit from Havre. The intelligence is of great interest; the most important item is the existence of the Anti-slavery clause in the city of London. It apparently appeared in the capital on the 12th of February. The forces which arrested it were, no doubt, that of a ship-surgeon, who, the day preceding, had been employed on board a vessel from Sunderland. The citizens generally did not notice its appearance; at the extinction of that struggle; but the effects of its appearance were visible through those engaged in political operations.

La France every thing remains in a state of tranquility; the Aborigine conspiracy has had no anterior influence on the present government. Public funds had improved. CONGRESSIONAL ASSEMBLY.—In the Senate on the 27th ult., Mr. Waggoner submitted a resolution prohibiting an inquiry into the expediency of granting \$500,000 worth of land to the State of Louisiana for the purpose of internal improvement. Several bills from the House were read twice and referred. The bill from the House for the relief of Benedict Joseph Labatut, whose name is distinguished, ordered to a third reading.
