
Mr. Kilebaw, chairman of the committee appointed on the fill May last, to receive the transfer of monies, promissory notes and other available means, from the Cuy Treasury to the General Suking Fund, submitted the following report, which was adopted. On motion of Mr. Canon, member of said committee.

Resolved, That said report be printed, to the number of fifty copies, with the resolution adopted on the 6th May last, appointing said committee.

The Committee of the Commissioners of the General Sinking Pund, to whom was referred the examination of the state of this Fund, and the accounts the cool, as rendered by J. M. Fleytas, Esq. late Treasurer, and made up to the 12th May last, in the first place beg leave to report, that the account so rendered by him of the Notes and Cash then deposited in the Union Bank, is correct;

That the stebt of the old Cerporation is as follows:

Thus the total amount of the debt of the old corporation, on the 13th May, 1836, was \$7,205,938—
