CITIZENS BANK OF LOUISIANA—Nea

That the Directors shall be selected from among the citizens of this state having the qualifications required by said charter, but without any reference to their place of residence; artivided they shall be actual citizens of the United States for the fast five years proceeding their election, and have been residents of the State for the same lapse of time; and that two partners shall not be eligible as directors of said company at the said time, ay serve in the same direction, nor shall a director of any other bank, or his partner be eligible as a director of this company.
