Civic attitudes – indirect measures:

- membership in organisations
- participation in demonstrations
- volunteering
- trust
- social capital

Western Europe more civic than Eastern Europe - a few examples

- Active membership in environmental organisations FR 6%, NL 4% - BG 0.4%, RU 0.4%
- Signed petition IT 54%, NO 69% UA 7%, PL 24%
- "Most people can be trusted" SE 68%, NL 45% -SI 18%, MD 18%

number of speakers of given language with internet access


And what did I get:

Look at this:



Volunteering is the practice of people working on behalf of others or a particular cause without payment for their time and services. (wikipedia) contributing to wipedia = volunteering

My explanation

contributing to wikipedia has a very low threshold for engagement
East Europeans dislike formal organisations (remember the photos?)
East Europeans like to use wikipedia as a platform for their social contribution

Caveats

- Lousy data particularly on volunteering
- "Large" languages (English, French) left out because it's impossible to estimate the number of people online
 This is a blog post than an academic
