NUOVA-ORLEANS, 9 DE SETIEMBRE.

La cámara de diputados ha adoptado en su sesión del 14 de julio el proyecto de ley relativo a la prolongación del permiso de introducir en los puertos de Méjico los artículos de Algodon cuya importación estaba prohibida por la ley de 23 de mayo 1839 y de cuya presentación hablamos no hace mucho, en uno de nuestros números. Los dos primeros artículos están concebidos en estos términos:

Art. 1.º Se establecerá un banco de giro para fomento de la industria nacional, con el capital de un millón de pesos.

Art. 2.º Para la formación de este capital se proroga por el tiempo necesario el permiso para la entrada en los puertos de la república de los generos de Algodon prohibidos por la ley de 22 de mayo del año anterior.

Esta ley que por lo importante a nuestros comerciantes no necesita de comentarios, siendo conocido por haberse discutido tiempo ha, sin duda no hubiera sido adoptada por la cámara de diputados si la opinión favorable del senado acerca de esta cuestión no hubiese sido presunta; es probable que este segundo organo del poder legislativo no reusará el sancionarla; y desde luego se puede considerar como definitivamente adoptada.

Un jefe de los del partido de Guerrero, llamado Larion, aprehendido cerca de Cortijos en el valle de Cuernavaca, habiendo intentado fugarse al paso de una barranca, fue fusilado como un loco por órden de jefe de su escolta. Semejante estado de cosas, por mas que se diga, no puede durar largo tiempo; no es en nuestro siglo ni en nuestro feliz continente donde se puede reinar por medio del terror. El herbo á que nos referimos se halla con signado en el diario oficial del gobierno mejicano (El Registro) del 9 de agosto, y la indiferencia con que refiere este hecho es verdaderamente estraña.

Méjico 11 de agosto.

Hay se ha difundido la noticia de que 5,000 hombres escaban han desembarcado en Cabo-rojo. La alarma ha sido general, y naturalmente se ha preguntado que origen y por que conducido se ha recibido esa noticia. El suplemento que acompaña a este número satisfica tan justa curiosidad. (1) Tres hombres cuyo origen no se sé, han saltado á la playa preguntando por los destacamentos que cubren aquellos puntos. Pueden ser españoles y pueden ser de cualquiera otra nación. La salida de una expedición de cinco mil hombres, no es cosa que se hace en un día ni en un mes, y sus preparativos en Cuba ó en Cádiz no podían estar ocultos para Francia, Inglaterra, ó para los Estados Unidos del Norte. De las tres partes tenemos los papeles mas recientes que pueden recibirse y en ninguno de ellos hemos encontrado una sola línea que hable de l' embarco de esos 5,000 hombres en Cádiz ó en la Habana. Los 1,500 que salieron para Cuba del primer punto en 23 de marzo se hallaban todavía en Canarias y la noticia de su salida se habia ya publicado en este periódico. Antes que se embarcaran los 3,500 que condujo Barradas se habian recibido comunicaciones que detallaban sus movimientos y preparativos para embarcarse en la Habana. Con que no hay la menor probabilidad en favor de esa expedición, y es preciso, creer que los tres exploradores, sean unos contrabandistas, que pretendan ejecutar en aquel punto, lo que otros ó tal vez ellos mismos, acaban de hacer en Matagorda en el estado de Texas, donde para dar el golpe seguro y no tener que ser espuesos al desembarco de sus efectos, aprisionaron al administrador y lo metieron en un bote con diez hombres de custodia. El supremo gobierno sin embargo ha tomado inmediatamente las providencias que ha creído oportunas. Mas nos atrevemos á asegurar, que es imposible en el orden comun de las cosas, que

IDRM 1.º de agosto. Se han recibido noticias del general Armijo fecha 23 del pasado julio. El general Armijo no ha encontrado resistencia en ninguna parte, pues los facciosos capitaneados por Alvarez habian sido sucesivamente abandonando todas las posiciones fuertes que ocupaban á la aproximación del mismo general, sin atreverse á intentar la defensa de ninguna, y por último, no perdida, todas habian huido á Coyula, donde Alvarez se esforzaba en ganar gente, usando para ello de los medios mas crueles y violentos, lo cual dá motivo á que la gente llevada por fuerza aproveche las ocasiones que se le ofrecen para fugarse á sus casas ó presentarse á varios destacamentos de tropas que han quedado en distintos puntos como se ha verificado en Chilpancingo donde se han presentado hasta ocho á la vez. El Sr. Armijo en su marcha se ha ocupado en organizar la defensa de todos los pueblos de alguna importancia del rumbo del Sur, prestándose las vecinas no solo voluntariamente, sino con entusiasmo á armarse para poner á cubierto á las personas y propiedades contra los atentados de unos hombres que han devastado el país, que ha tenido la deprecación de estar bajo su dominio, y en el que han vivido sin respetar propiedades ni personas, tropelando todo para mantener la reunión de gentes que formaron y á la que no lo pagan, sino que la mantienen con topoto que obligan á dar á los pueblos y ranchos, de jandola cometer toda especie de excesos. En Chilapa quedaban perfectamente armados 200 vecinos, en Iguala 300 y así en otros puntos saliendo á recorrer los campos, merced á cuyas providencias todo el país desde el Papagayo á esta capital está perfectamente seguro y tranquilo, y de Papagayo en adelante sólo quedan algunos bandidos dispersos, que solo podrán interceptar alguna correo, ó cometer algun robo parcial.
