There are few curiosities in Tunis. The most worthy objects of notice are the palace of the deceased Bey and the warm baths. We visited almost all parts of the palace, and its interior is the most splendid of any thing in architecture I have seen.

The baths are by steam. We passed by a long, dark avenue, into a spacious hall, so full of steam, that it was almost suffocating. About twenty Turks were seated in their stalls, with their feet doubled under them.

Few of us, it was said, came off with whole skins. It was a very bad business, and I do not venture to repeat it.
