IMPERIAL PAWNSHOP.

Austria Conducts the Pawnshop. Austria has an imperial pawn shop. It was established in Vienna in 1707, when there was great distress among the poor in the southern part of the empire. It was designed as a way to secure relief, and by putting the way to interest as low as possible, and embodying in the system every advantage that could be given to those who sought to secure loans, it was found to be so effective that it soon gained the imperial sanction, and it was not long until its managers were made public officials under the direction of the minister of the interior. This is substantially the status of the institution at this time.

BLUE ASBESTOS.

Canada and Italy Have a Serious Competitor in Africa. Canadian and Italian asbestos will find a serious competitor in the blue asbestos recently discovered in the Cape Colony, since the South African product is less than half as heavy and furnishes fibers considerably finer and longer than any other, says the Detroit Tribune. The South African fiber has been worked into webs, which are but little inferior to those made of vegetable fiber, and are absolutely fireproof. Twine, cord and rope made of this blue asbestos will not only resist fire, but also most of the known chemicals, corrosive vapors and atmospheric influences. These qualities will open a new field for the employment of asbestos fabrics in chemical laboratories, and for the caulking of chemical apparatus. A novel application of this material is the working of blue asbestos fiber into mattresses for hospitals. They are cooler in summer and warmer in winter than those made of either animal hair or vegetable fiber, and no vermin can live in this mattress. Experiments are now being made of working this fiber into cloth for fireproofing apparatus. Of course the long fiber blue asbestos can also be employed for the same purposes as the white asbestos has been put heretofore. While a trifle more expensive, its superior qualities make it well worth the difference.

COMFORT FOR MAN AND BEAST.

The Picture Presented on a Big Canal Boat Tied Up Over Sunday. Tied alongside a bulkhead in the Harlem river was a big canal boat. In the stable at one end stood three horses munching hay out of their mangers, says the New York Sun. The deck over the horses, forming the roof of their stable, was a foot or two, or maybe more than that, higher than the surrounding deck, and it was open all around, so that the breeze blew through freely. It was a hot day, but the horses were in the shade, in place where they could get the air if they could get it anywhere; then they had plenty to eat, and they were apparently as comfortable as horses could be.

BURDENED WITH APRICOTS.

Fruit growers in California are amazed at the extent of the apricot crop. The quantity of the fruit coming in is simply overwhelming, and it would seem that every tree in the valley had this year taken to bearing the luscious fruit. The driers are unable to take care of the fruit coming in, and are forced to reject much of it after it is picked. One man who could not dispose of his apricots after they were picked dumped two tons by the roadside, and there are a number of growers who will not attempt to harvest their crops.

CANNON BALL STORY.

Alfred Grissom Tells of a Narrow Escape in Alabama. Alfred Grissom, the manager of the summer excursion boats, has a cannon ball story which he says is Gospel truth. People in the excursion business have a strict regard for veracity, and many of his friends believe every word of it, says the St. Louis Republic.
