BOBBIN-NET TRADE.—The capital employed in this trade is estimated at 2,310,000; the number of persons employed, men, women, and children, 211,000. The quantity of raw cotton consumed is, annually, 1,600,000 lbs. value, 120,000. This cotton is manufactured into yarn, and its value increased to 500,000; the yarn is then worked into 6,750,000 square yards of power-net, 15,750,000 square yards of hand-net, and 150,000 square yards of fancy-net, worth, altogether, 1,825,240. Of new silk there is also used about 250,000 lbs. worth, 30,000, which, when thrown and worked into 750 square yards of silk-net, becomes worth 65,625. The total quantity of cotton and silk bobbin-net annually manufactured, is 23,400,000 square yards; value, 1,901,000. The total number of machines employed is stated to be 4,500; of machine owners, 1,382; of these machines 1,000 work in their own machines.—London Globe.
