gent et les différentes classifications qu'exige  
un système d'éducation qui embrasse la toute  
des études classiques.

40.—La nécessité non moins impérieuse d'une  
vaste enceinte dont la distribution permet de su-  
pporter les jeunes élèves des élèves plus âgés, ainsi  
d'éloigner autant que possible les dangers d'ac-  
cident et les inconvénients de tout genre qui  
résultent nécessairement de la circulation des fils.

Tel est le résumé des motifs qui ont déterminé  
M. Cavellier à épérer ce changement. Il laisse-

ment encore à celui des personnes qui l'honorent  
en lui confiant l'éducation de leurs enfants. Il

50.—Guillot, professeur de mathématiques au  
Collège Louisianais, étant obligé de s'absenter

ingénieur des ponts et chaussées, déjà connu sous  
les plus favorables rapports, et recommandé d'ail-  
lors par M. le général Bernard à M. Roiglencq,  
Pitt et d'autres citoyens respectables de cette  
ville.

Considérant combien il est difficile de faire ob-  
server à des jeunes gens dont le caractère est dé-  
jà formé, les règles indispensables dans une ma-  
ison d'éducation, M. Cavellier se voit dans la né-  
cessité d'annoncer au public qu'il sera déso-  
mme impossible d'admettre au nombre de ses élè-  
ves des jeunes gens au dessous de l'âge de qua-  
tre ans.

ves, sont priées de venir immédiatement d'abord  
l'entrée de l'établissement.

LATE PARISIAN NEWS.

The Courier of the 9th Feb. says that the general belief is, that the Turkish government had intimated to the Allied Powers, through the medium of Austria, greater willingness to approximate to the conditions laid down in the treaty of the 6th of July. The same paper says that there is no probability of a war.

Mr. Hobhouse is before the House of Commons, a report of thanks to Admiral Codrington. It was resolved unanimously of the novelty of the proceeding. In the course of the debate, it was said that his Majesty's ministers were determined to carry into the strictest execution the treaty of the 6th of July.

On motion of Mr. Peel, a finance committee has been appointed by the house of commons. It is composed of able men of both parties. It is empowered to inquire into and state the income and expenditure of the kingdom, and to consider what retrenchments can be made without detriment to the public service.

Lord Cochrane has left Greece for Europe; the reason of his return is suggested to be the need of further supplies and necessities for the Greek cause.

Accounts from Malta state that Count Cabo d'Istria had arrived at Malta on the 9th of January. The vessels of Ibrahim on leaving Navarino, had an engagement with a Greek squadron, which they defeated.

In Spain a conspiracy had been discovered at Saragossa, and four officers had been shot. It is said that the French will evacuate Cadiz and that the government was forming a force of 8,000 men to take the place of the French troops. The prime leader of the Catalonia Insurrection Jep del Estang has been taken.
