
III. *Observations upon dissecting the Body of a Person troubled with the Stone. By Dr. Perrot Williams, Physician at Haverford-West in South-Wales.*

MR. *William Bowen* of the Town and County of *Haverford-West*, aged between 40 and 50, having been, for about the Space of seven Years, severely afflicted with the usual Symptoms of the Stone in the Kidneys and Bladder, *viz.* Bloody Urine after Exercise, Strangury, &c. Dy'd in *May 1722*. His Body being opened, there were found in the Bladder six smooth oval Stones, exactly of the same Figure, and nearly of the same Magnitude: There were also three Cells in each Kidney, the Figure of each suitable to that of the Stones: The *Ureters* were so preternaturally extended, as very easily to admit the largest of the Stones to pass from the Kidney to the Bladder. The *Viscera*, &c. appear'd in their natural State.
