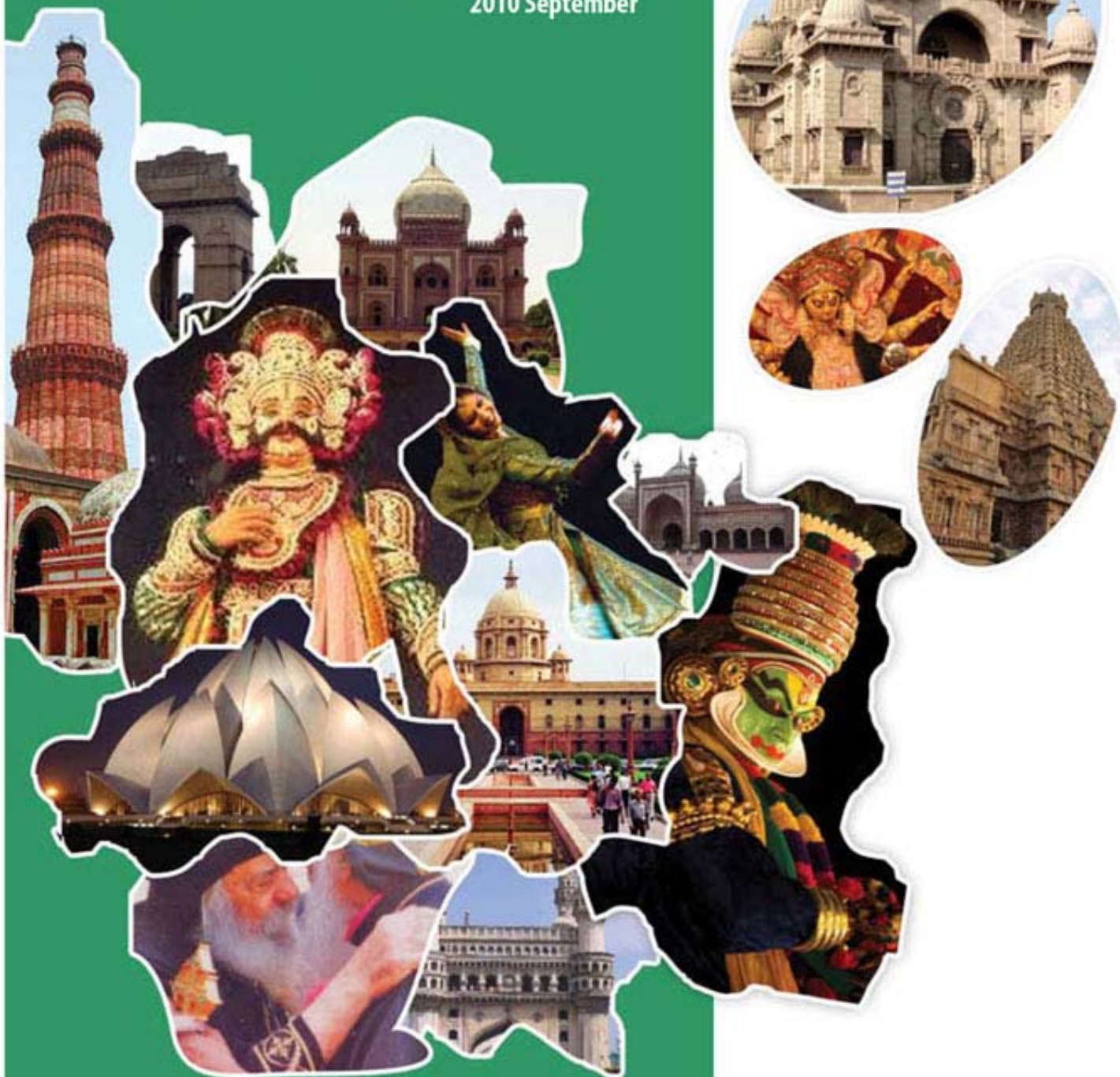

About This Newsletter

Dear Indian Wikimedians,

It gives us intense pleasure to be the part of a team which consists of some of the active wikimedians from various Indian language wiki communities. Yes, finally we were able to bring out the Newsletter about the activities of different Indian language wiki communities.

The aim of this news letter is to bring together the wiki communities of all the Indian languages (including the Indian wikimedians working in English wiki projects) by sharing the news about their various activities. This is the first edition of this newsletter. For time being, the frequency of newsletter is planned for once in 3 or 4 months. Even though we have Wikipedias available in more than 20 Indian languages (See [Appendix 1](#) on page 27 for a detailed list of wiki projects), currently only 8 wiki communities are active enough to contribute to this newsletter. When more wiki communities become active and more people join this effort we can think about a monthly newsletter. Wikimedia India chapter will have a greater role to play in this regard. As you all know, we don't have an example to follow. Ours is a unique case that involves many languages and many wiki projects. There are lot technical and usability issues that are common to all the Indian languages. Bringing different language wiki communities together itself is a very big task.

How can we bring together all the Indian wiki communities? What is the need of it? Will sharing community news help other language wiki projects? Many of the above questions are answered or will be answered in future through Wikimedia India Newsletter. As the interaction increases and the information is shared, we are sure this initiative will benefit various Indian Language wiki communities.

You can see from the Newsletter that all the wiki communities that contributed content to this Newsletter are organizing various outreach programs to popularize their wiki projects among the speakers of the respective language. That is, their wiki activism is not confined to wiki editing. They conduct workshops, wiki meet-ups, exhibitions, seminars, and so on to popularize wiki. Tamil wikimedians have conducted wiki workshops even out side of India (Canada, Europe). Malayalam wikimedians had released an offline version of the selected wikipedia articles. All these programs had helped to increase the awareness about the wiki projects among the speakers of that language.

Even though the current format of the Newsletter is PDF, various other formats needs to be explored as we move forward. But since the content is huge there might be many design challenges for each format.

We thank all who had supported, criticized, and provided various suggestions to improve this newsletter.

The Wikimedia India Community: Where We Are Now

In India, the Wikimedia community tends to be quite different from Wikimedia communities in other parts of the world. For one thing, India has number of language communities apart from English. Within India, Wikipedias - of various strength and size - exist in about 20 Indian languages. Another 20 Indian language Wikipedias are in incubator stage. Given that there are literally over a 100 languages with more than 100,000 speakers, it is worth noting that there is a long way to go - and many more Indian language Wikipedias to come

English And Native Indian Language Wiki Communities

Indians working on English Wikipedia form perhaps the most active Wikimedia community in the country. This might be surprising for many people outside India, but within, it is fairly obvious that English is an important Indian language (it is one of India's "official" languages) and also the most significant bridging language between different language groups. Indeed, English is the language that connects Wikimedians from various language groups in India. What we call the "mother tongue" (i.e. the native Indian language of one's parents) is usually not English, and yet for a number of people, English remains the preferred operating language in educational, professional and online life.

As much as English Wikipedia is a crucial aspect of India's presence on Wikimedia, the growth of projects in Indian languages is equally important. Unfortunately, awareness of the fact that Wikipedias exist in Indian languages is minimal - and while several language speakers have been trained to look for news and entertainment information online, they tend to be largely unaware of the significant presence of Indian language material on Wikimedia.

Current Status Of Indian Language Wiki Communities

While some Indian language Wikimedia communities are very active (most of these are in South India), that is not the case with all Indian language communities. In general, a smart way of thinking about the growth of Indian language Wikipedias is to consider each language community distinctly, as each region - and its speakers - bring a unique set of circumstances, challenges and opportunities to the table.

Punjabi has 88 million speakers the world over and Punjabi Wikipedia was the first Indian language Wikipedia. It started way back in June, 2002. Today, surprisingly, it is relatively inactive, and shows very little growth in terms of the number of articles. Even though Punjabi Wikipedia has been in existence for more than 8 years, it hardly has 2000 articles. Why is this so?

In the case of the Oriya language, it has 31 million speakers (almost the same number as those who speak Malayalam and Kannada). And Oriya wikipedia also started off in June, 2002. Yet, today - 8 years later - Oriya Wikipedia has less than 700 articles. Once again, the question is, why is this so? How is the lack of activity in Oriya Wikipedia similar to or different from Punjabi Wikipedia?

An interesting case is that of the Bishnupriya Manipuri Wikipedia. Bishnupriya Manipuri is a language that has just 500,000 speakers and yet Bishnupriya Manipuri Wikipedia is one of the fairly successful Indian language Wikipedias with more than 24,000 articles to date, which shows that it is not only the number of speakers of a language that is determining the state of its presence on Wikipedia.

Languages like Assamese, Kashmiri and Sindhi are yet fledgling projects and require the help and support of the Indian community to get off the ground. Many such Indian languages require to be urgently supported by a few dedicated people.

Interaction Between Language Communities

Bringing Wikimedia communities of different Indian languages together (including English) is a big challenge. Even though we have more than 20 successful Indian language Wikipedias, not all their communities are active. There is particularly little interaction between different groups working on Wikipedias in native Indian languages. One of the main reasons for this is the absence of a forum for interaction between language communities. The hope is that to some extent this newsletter will bridge that gap.

Awareness About The Sister Projects

Wikipedia has, of course, various sister projects like Wikisource, Wiktionary, Wikimedia Commons, Wikibooks, Wikiquote, Wikinews, Wikiversity, and so on. Many Wikimedians in India are not aware about the fact that many of these projects are available in most of the Indian languages. Surprisingly, in some cases, Wikipedians who work in a local language are not aware that there are sister projects in the same language. Yet, projects like Wikisource and Wiktionary have huge potential in all Indian languages. It is surprising to note that a language like Sanskrit still does not have its own Wikisource domain (though a few Sanskrit source texts are in incubator at <http://wikisource.org>).

Community members who edit in Bengali are giving special attention to Wikisource. Tamil editors are actively adding to Tamil Wiktionary. But this is not so for most Indian languages, and currently, the focus seems to be almost solely on Wikipedia.

Awareness About The Mailing Lists

Most communities are yet to start a mailing list to communicate across users. In most Indian language Wikipedias, the only method of communication available is through talk pages. Many communities are not even aware that they can create a Wikimedia mailing list for communication. Perhaps it is time that all language communities make use of mailing lists.

There is a Wikimedia India mailing list that is meant to draw Wikimedians from every sphere (and language, or interest in India) together. Unfortunately, many Wikimedians - even some of the more active ones - are not yet aware that this list exists.

About Wikimedia Foundation India Chapter

Wikimedia Foundation's India Chapter has had a long history. First efforts to set up a chapter began in 2004 September with an IRC meeting and efforts continued through 2007 November when there was another round of discussions on the India mailing list and draft bye-laws were drawn up. However, the efforts received a huge boost with two things, first, Sue Gardner and Jimmy Wales visited Bangalore in 2008 December and second, regular Wiki-meetups in Bangalore that were made possible by the Centre for Internet and Society. In 2009 July, discussions and activity commenced and this culminated with India becoming the 29th chapter of the Wikimedia Foundation in 2010 July.

While the Chapter has been recognised by the Foundation, we are still waiting to become a registered organisation in India (Karnataka) – the process is however underway, and registration is expected shortly. The next step is to qualify for tax exemption. Regardless, there are several chapter activities that can commence prior to registration (work that does not involve funds) and even more at every stage in the registration process.

The Chapter has a fundamental mission of catalysing the usage and editorship of Wikipedia in India with a focus on fostering Indic language content. To this end, there are multiple tracks the Chapter will need to take to achieve this overall goal - Content, Technology, Outreach, Collaborations, Offline Work, creating Special Interest Groups and Projects.

Bengali Wikipedia

Bengali Wikipedia is the biggest wiki in Bengali Language and the most active wiki among all the Wikimedia Projects in Bengali. As of 2010 July Bengali Wikipedia has over 21,500 articles. The site has over 14,600 site registered users. Bengali Wikipedia has 8 administrators. Among 8 administrators, 2 are from India and the rest are from Bangladesh. According to List of Wikipedias (http://meta.wikimedia.org/wiki/List_of_Wikipedias)

Bengali Wikipedia has page depth 102, which is the second among all the Indian language Wikipedias after Malayalam.

Bengali Wikisource

Bengali Wikisource is the youngest Wikimedia project in Bengali language. Bengali Wikisource started on 2007 September right after Wikimania 2007. But this wiki is the second most active after Bengali Wikipedia. Very recently Bengali Wikisource has been crossed the 5,000 pages milestone. Bengali Wikisource has the literary works of many prominent writers of Bengali language including Rabindranath Tagore. According to List of Wikisource (<http://meta.wikimedia.org/wiki/Wikisource>) page, Bengali Wikisource is now at rank 21 among 56 Wikisource based on number of content pages.

Other Projects In Bangla

Other than Wikipedia and Wikisource, Wiktionary and Wikibooks projects are available in Bengali language. But they are least active projects in Bengali. Recently there is some initiative from the community to increase the contributor at the project. The community is so active in collection and upload free licensed regional photos at Wikimedia Commons site. Also community localized 100% of

most often used messages and 85% of MediaWiki messages at <http://translatewiki.net>. Also community is active in translation of site notice messages at Meta site.

Bengali Wikimedia Community

The members of Bengali Wikimedia Community are mainly from Bangladesh and from the West Bengal. From 2005, to promote Wikipedia and other Wikimedia projects, the community members from Bangladesh have focused on Bengali blog sites and have written numerous blogs related to projects and activities in different popular blog sites. Bangladeshi Wikimedia community identifies that Bengali blog sites are the place where Bengali Wikimedia projects can get a good number of contributors who can type Bengali in Unicode at their PC.

In different occasions, Bangladeshi members of the community have published news items in the national newspapers regarding the projects and the activities to spread the words of Wikipedia to the mass people all over the country. They regularly arrange physical or online meet-ups in Dhaka, the capital of Bangladesh, and in regional towns. They already conducted some workshops on Wikipedia in different universities with help of local Open Source communities. To collect free licensed photos related to Bangladesh for Wikimedia projects, the Bangladeshi Wikimedia community has campaigned several times and collected and uploaded thousands of photos in Wikimedia Commons for use in Wikipedia and other projects. Also, they are working with local individuals and organizations to collect photos and references about Bangladesh.

Bangladeshi Wikimedia community is planning to form Wikimedia Chapter called "Wikimedia Bangladesh". Wikimedia Bangladesh now has a meta page, a mailing list, Facebook page and twitter account to contact with them. The URLs are:

Indian Community In English Wiki Projects – Community News

English wikipedia is the flagship project of Wikimedia foundation. English wikipedia is edited by wikimedians from all parts of the world. There are many wikipedians from India contributing to English Wikipedia. Perhaps Indians working in English wikipedia is one of the most active wiki community from India. Introduction

Indian wikipedians actively contribute to English wikipedia on various topics not limiting to India related ones. There are more than 75 Indian or Indian origin editors with more than 5,000 edits on English wikipedia. Indian wiki community is dedicated to mainly improving Wikipedia's coverage of topics related to the Republic of India and the history and culture of the Indian subcontinent. The efforts of Indian Wikipedians in English wikipedia is coordinated through WikiProject India.

WikiProject India

A WikiProject is a project by a group of editors to manage and collaborate articles on a specific topic or family of topics within the Wikipedia. [WikiProject India or WP:INDIA](#) is one of the largest WikiProjects on the English Wikipedia. It is a group dedicated to improving Wikipedia's coverage of topics related to the Republic of India and the history and culture of Indian subcontinent. The project was started by veteran Wikipedian [User:Ganeshk](#) in 2006 July. There were only 35 featured articles and 2 GAs, related to India, during the start of the WikiProject.

The goals of this group are three-fold:

- provide guidelines and recommendations for articles that describe aspects of India.
- improve Wikipedia's coverage of India by creating, expanding, and maintaining factual articles.
- serve as the point of discussion for issues related to India in Wikipedia.

To achieve the above goals, this project group has developed features to help in managing its creative work. It includes Departments, which coordinate work on certain tasks, such as peer review or project-wide collaboration and Work Groups, and focus on content and articles related to India, such as cities, politics and culture.

Departments include – Assessment, Automation, Cartography, Collaboration, Outreach, Peer review, Photography, Translation, and Anti Vandalism. Tasks of department include authoring, maintaining the project pages, administering portals, adding articles, reviews, managing the project, and so on.

Workgroups include – Geography (we have wikigroups for each state and UTs), Religion, Media & communications (One each for Cinema and Television). We have dedicated workgroups for Maps of India and Transport systems in India. We also have Indian wikipedians who contribute to various other global communities like for UN workgroups, Cricket workgroups and different scientific / technology / cultural workgroups/wikiprojects.

It now has around 48 workgroups on India related sub-topics and ~350 active members under [WP:INDIA](#). Every India state now has an active workgroup. The project currently has 78,000+ India related articles under the project scope, with 60 Featured Articles (FA), 16 featured lists, and 132 Good articles (GA). Project newsletters were started as early as in 2006 September.

Featured Articles dropped from 68 in June 2009 to 60 while GA articles grew from 86 to 132 in Sep 2010. The maximum number of India related FA articles ever reached were 72. The drop in the FA articles motivated wikipedians to work on improving the quality of articles on India, which can be attributed to rise of India related GAs.

[Portal:India](#), the flag ship portal of the WikiProject, was started by [User:Arunram](#) in 2005 February.

Translation Department

The translation department of the WikiProject India aims to utilize high-quality non-English material related to India for the goals of the project. This includes both translating articles from and to other-language Wikipedias as well as assisting contributors with non-English sources. The department aims to provide services in transliteration, formulating scripts for various

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languages, as well as translating articles from one language to another and validating sources in other languages to that of the encyclopedia article.

Other Activities

- [India Quiz or WP:PINQ](#) is a popular forum of interaction among Indian Wikipedians. It run as a friendly competition among Wikipedians to test and improve the knowledge of India.
- India Noticeboard [WT:INB / Wikipedia talk:Noticeboard for India-related topics](#) is the the centre of discussion on Indian articles and other India related stuff on Wikipedia.
- Wikicamp @ Chennai in 2007 February 25 was attended by Jimmy Wales. It was attended by over 300 Wiki enthusiasts from all around India.
- [User:Ganeshk's](#) bot created articles on 5000 Indian towns based on 2001 census data.
- [A picture shot in India](#), won the [Commons:Picture of the Year contest 2009](#). Translations of the description in Indian languages are solicited.
- [WP:IND/UBLP](#) effort brought down the number of unreferenced BLPs from 1500+ to 560.
- [User:TinucherianBot](#) works on auto-tagging india related articles with project banners based on India related categories and auto assessment based on stub categories or other Wikiproject banners on the same article talk page.
- [WP:WTCI](#), photo hunt based on Wikipedia Takes City was organised as part of Madras day celebration 2009 and got us 30+ pictures to commons. More photo hunts needs to be planned across India.
- English wikipedians [User:Arunram](#), [User:Naveenpf](#), [User:Rsrikanth05](#) conducted a wiki academy for Sanskrit Wikipedia.

Did You Know (DYK)

Did you know (DYK) facts are trivia picked up from newly created/expanded wikipedia articles and displayed on the main page.

Over 1300 India related articles have appeared on the DYK (Did You Know) section on English Wikipedia main page in the last 5 years.

[User:Nvvchar](#) an Indian Wikipedian, Septuagenarian is one of the top 15 DYK creators globally with 246 DYKs.

Brief History

Hindi Wikipedia is the Hindi language edition of Wikipedia. It was launched on 2003 July.

Hindi Wikipedia had crossed 10,000 articles on 2007 December 6. The milestone of 50,000 articles was crossed on 2009 September 14.

Hindi wikipedia is the biggest wikipedia project among all the Indian languages in terms of total number of articles and the number of registered users.

Current Status

As of 2010 August 31, Hindi Wikipedia had 56,000 articles, 34,000 registered users, and 278 active users. Hindi Wikipedia has 5 bureaucrats, 24 Admins, 9 reviewers and 43 bots.

Hindi Wikipedians aim to provide most important articles to their readers. The quality of Hindi Wikipedia articles can be measured from the number of its featured articles.

Focus On Usability

There is active focus on improving usability. For this, we started to improve the Mediawiki used for Hindi Wikipedia. Many gadgets were installed on Hindi Wikipedia. We also created a new user group **Interface administrator**. Any wiki admin having technical ability and software interface knowledge is welcome to join this group to introduce any new feature in Hindi Wikipedia.

Google Translation Project In Hindi Wikipedia

In 2010 July, Google announced that they had begun working with Hindi Wikipedians to translate English language articles into Hindi and had so far translated 600,000 words in Hindi using a combination of Google Translate and manual review / checking. This coordinated translation has been responsible for a 20% rate of growth for the site.

Sister Projects Of Hindi Wikipedia

The sister projects of Hindi wikipedia are wiktionary, Wikibooks, and wikiquote. Hindi wiktionary is active to some extent. It has definitions for 1885 words as of 2010 August 31.

Other sister projects of Hindi wikipedia are waiting for the arrival of few dedicated users. Wikisource project for Hindi is not yet started in its own domain (hi.wikisource.org). Some source text is available at http://wikisource.org/wiki/Main_Page:Hindi

New Interface

Hindi Wikipedia and its sister wiki projects are moved to the new interface (vector) on 2010 September 1. The transliteration tool for typing Hindi in Hindi wikipedia is also enhanced within few days after it is moved to new interface. Future advocacy programs

Hindi Wikipedians are working hard to make the encyclopedia in Hindi more comprehensive. Hindi Wikipedians are looking to organise public events to let all Hindi speakers know about Hindi Wikipedia projects.

Wikimedia India Community Newsletter

Some of the programs planned for future are:

- Good article categorisation to make offline CD/DVD of Hindi wikipedia articles.
- Conduct Wikipedia meetups and workshops to reach the speakers of the Hindi language
- Enhance user interface and tools.
- Encourage other Indian language Wiki admins to join Hindi wiki who are good in Hindi and technical aspects.
- Update featured articles frequently on the main page.
- Special attention is being given to new column on the main page.
- Encourage the usage of common wiki embassy for all Indian languages to interact with each other in technical and some other aspects.

Brief History

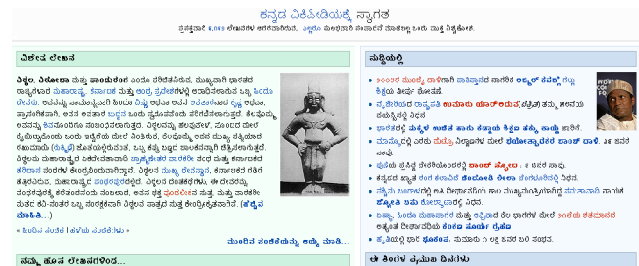
Kannada Wikipedia was initiated in 2004 September with an article on Rashttrakavi (National Poet) Kuvempu. The project has since grown with several contributors to 9,100+ articles. Although the Kannada speaking population on Internet is a tiny fraction of the overall number of total speakers of the language, the number adapting to new technology and Internet has been increasing sharply. The recent gradual progress in the number of active contributors is a reflection to this.



Mediawiki Translation

Although it is a continued project to translate the interface to adapt better to the users, the free software that runs Wikipedia - 'Mediawiki' has had good quality translations in Kannada language.

Several Firsts In Indian Language Projects

Kannada Wikipedia has had editors from India and abroad. Students, professionals residing outside the country have equally contributed to the project as have passionate editors from the state. There have been several firsts on Kannada projects in comparison to other Indian language Wiki projects.

An event was organized on 2006 April 2 at Kannada Bhavana, Bangalore to introduce Wikipedia to the media and the users. This was the first event to be held in the entire country that was solely dedicated to introducing concept of Wikipedia to largely novice Internet users in local language. The event was organized with the help from Wikimedia foundation. The press briefings organized after the event had resulted in some major newspapers picking up stories about Wikipedia in local languages.

Wiktionary

Kannada Wiktionary is another project that has had substantial activity, with over 70,771 dictionary entries.

Kannada Wiktionary has improved and its entries have sprung up in number. It is now one of the largest Wiktionary projects in Indian languages behind Tamil which is leading in numbers.

Wikibooks

Kannada Wikibooks has had its share of contributions with around 337 articles yet home for some valuable text available in public domain.

Community Overview

Kannada Wikipedia over the last few years has had a little but steadily growing and vibrant community with contributors: software engineers, a neuro surgeon to high school teachers, retired professionals to scientists editing the wiki. Given that the editors do this in free time, not everyone have been active at all the time. The group of editors which was limited to those well versed with technology (for there were limitations in setting up input methods to use local language script) earlier has now grown beyond to include people who were once unable to key-in using the local language to contribute although they were passionate about doing so. This change can well be attributed to improvements in technology on various platforms that have allowed easy to use input methods (not to forget Google transliteration). There have been some excellent editors contributing from outside India (mainly students residing in US), who after their educational course have gone almost completely inactive perhaps owing to the hectic schedule of work life. Some old time editors are also now missing from the scene - some taking up other roles, but not distant from the community.

Potential For Growth

Roughly 30 million speak Kannada in India. There is an increasing population outside the country with interest in language and the culture. With more and more native speakers getting easy access to Internet over mobile and via affordable broadband in the state, the potential for growth of Kannada projects seems to be good.

Roadblocks

The immediate roadblock for many contributors is to get help on some basic stuff like

- i) how to set-up the IME (on either desktop or use online),
- ii) which layout to use to learn typing in Kannada (there are "phonetic", "kgp layout" and "inscript" along many others to choose from)
- iii) how to add articles with the wiki formatting
- iv) how to add images.

To overcome the lack of support for users having limitation with technology, an FAQ page was setup as early as 2004 at http://kn.wikipedia.org/wiki/Wikipedia:Kannada_Supp_ort that catered to most users with some knowledge of technology. The necessity to read up and set-up the system to render Unicode properly itself turned out to be a challenge (it is continuing to be even

now) as some platforms do not support Kannada rendering out-of-box.

An Alternative Project By The Government? Not Quite

In 2009, the Karnataka government announced a project that was intended to be 'similar to Wikipedia'. The brief project description projected on media that had a symbolic reference to Wikipedia led to speculation that the government is trying to build another Wikipedia. Turns out though that the project being carved out by the Knowledge Commission has more ambitious objectives to garner 'creative' content and literature from all round the state to a collective knowledge base different from Wikipedia. The initial discussions, debates surrounding the project suggested that the commission intends in asserting the need for a government monitored editorial board which again is quite different from the community moderated Wikipedia.

Efforts are on presently to persuade the state Knowledge commission to release content it has been gathering in Creative Commons and in a framework that would allow easy use and portability of content.

A scientist who is addicted to Wikipedia:

Haldodderi

Sudhindra is a popular columnist on Vijaya Karnataka, the largest selling and most followed newspaper in the state. With a most respected profile of having been a research fellow at the reputed Indian

Institute of Science, an officer at The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO), and DGM at Hindustan Aeronautics Limited, Haldodderi Sudhindra has now taken up teaching for Aeronautics aspirants in a reputed Engineering college of Bangalore. Perhaps with academics came the exposure to Wikipedia, but the respected writer says "I'm now addicted to Wikipedia!". He finds himself reading articles on Kannada Wikipedia every day and adding/editing topics that interest him, mostly biographical or astronomy related.

Brief History

Malayalam Wikipedia (<http://ml.wikipedia.org/>) was launched on 2002 December 21. Initial growth was slow - it took two years to reach the 100 article milestone. Main obstacles in growth were browser related issues and the lack of tools to type in Malayalam Unicode. The issues were resolved gradually. The number and the diversity of articles improved after the arrival of few active users. Malayalam wikipedia reached 1000 article milestone on 2006 September. 10,000th article was born on 2009 June 1.

Malayalam wiki community keeps its interest over sister projects also rather than concentrating only on wikipedia. A community has formed around Wikisource and Wiktionary also.

Current Status

Wikipedia is the most active Malayalam wiki project. Malayalam Wikipedia has more than 14,000 articles as of 2010 September 7. Wikisource and Wiktionary are also active. Recently there are some initiative from the community to make the Wikibooks and Wikiquotes also active.

Malayalam Wikipedia

When comparing to the other Indian language wikipedias, Malayalam wikipedia/community leads in some key quality matrices. Some of them are:

- Highest number of revisions per article (More than 30 on average)
- Highest number total edits (More than 9,00,000 (9lakhs))
- Highest number of uploaded images (most of these images are free from all types of copyright issues)
- The first Indian wiki community to release the offline version (CD) of wiki articles.
- The first Indian language Wiki community from where a steward (Jyothis) is elected.

Even though Malayalam wikipedia fares better in quality measures, it lags behind in article count. The main reason for this is a key decision and trend from the earlier days. We give more priority to the quality of articles than to the quantity of articles. Initial active users made sure that the new articles had at least fundamental information, and they transferred this tradition to new comers. We are sure that as more users arrive, the number of articles will also increase.

Malayalam wikipedia has number of wiki projects, which are the joint activities of the users who are interested in particular topics. Wiki projects help the community to retain users for a long period of time. A few examples are the Astronomy, Melakartha raga (an Indian classical music raga), and Categorization wiki projects. Astronomy wiki project maintains the Astronomy portal of Malayalam Wikipedia. The users of this project are keen on starting new articles and maintaining the articles that are related to Astronomy. Mela kartha raga project is lead by users interested in Indian classical music. Because of this project Malayalam Wikipedia has articles about all the 72 Melakartha Ragas written in a systematic way. Categorization wiki project handles the scientific categorization of all the articles in Malayalam Wikipedia. Wiki projects like these keeps people active in Wikipedia and retain them in wikies for a longer period of time. Wiki projects also leads to new ideas. Some examples are, Malayalam wikipedia CD project, e-book about the FAQ of Malayalam Wiki projects, and so on.

Malayalam Wikisource

Malayalam Wikisource (Wiki Granthasala) was started on 2006 March. Over the past 4 years Malayalam Wikisource has collected some of the best Malayalam source texts. Religious texts like Bhagavad Gita, Bhagavatham, Bible, Qur'an, Ramayana, and so on are already part of Malayalam Wikisource. Malayalam transliteration of some other Indian language source texts are also included. For example, the works of Sankaracharya which is in Sanskrit, is transliterated to Malayalam script.

Wikimedia India Community Newsletter

We are trying to collect the complete works of notable writers of Malayalam. Compilation of the complete works of Sri Narayana Guru - the spiritual leader and social reformer of Kerala - is completed recently. Currently, the works of Changapuzha Krishnapilla and Kumaranasan are getting added. Notable source texts and the works of notable personalities of Malayalam will be added to Malayalam wikisource soon. We hope Malayalam Wikisource will soon become the online reference library of Malayalam language.

Malayalam Wiktionary

Malayalam Wiktionary (<http://ml.wiktionary.org/>) intends to create a free content dictionary, providing definitions in Malayalam for the words in all the other languages. As of 2010 August 31, there are 60,155 words in Malayalam Wiktionary. Of these definitions, around 40,000 definitions are of Malayalam words and 20,000 are English words. Notably, there are definitions of 250 Japanese words, 130 Tamil words, 100 Korean words and several words in Chinese, Arabic, and Hindi. The project has progressed significantly in the last two years growing from a Wiktionary with 1700 definitions in 2008 January to where it is today. There is significant need for volunteers not only to add new definitions, but also to refine, expand, and categorize existing definitions.

Recent Advocacy Programs

Malayalam wikimedians had organized their third wiki meetup at Emakulam, Kerala on 2010 April 17. 40 active Malayalam wikimedians and 40 newcomers had attended this meetup.

Brief History

Marathi Wikipedia is one of the leading wikis among South Asian language wikis and it was started on 2003 May 1.

The growth in the first 3 years was very slow. On 2006 January it was having just 1500 articles. By 2007 January, the total edits in Marathi wikipedia reached 50,000 edits. Compare this with the present scenario, where we have one user with over 50,000 edits. By 2008 September, Marathi Wikipedia crossed 20,000 articles. As of 2010 August Marathi Wikipedia has more than 30,000 articles and more than 5,80,000 edits. Marathi Wikipedia has made slow but steady progress in growing its content and user-base. While we face similar difficulties as the rest of the Indian language wikis, we have devised and adapted several ways to overcome these. In the initial stages, the focus was more on creating consensus on the correct writing practices and supporting the new editors. Now the focus is shifting slowly towards providing reader oriented help and concentrating on various online reader oriented and quality improvement projects.

At many instances Marathi Wikipedia covered important issues that concern to common people. For example, when swine flue break out in 2008 wikis came up with various articles related to that with at least primary level information. Marathi Wikipedia community has been ahead in giving timely encyclopedic coverage of major international sports events, and also democratic elections at assembly and parliamentary level. Now Marathi Wikipedia dreams a target reaching 1 lakh articles by the end of 2011. Certainly the target is big, but if the community grows we can achieve more than this. We are planning for some public outreach programs to reach the speakers of the Marathi language.



Support For New Editors

Every new user in mr wiki gets a welcome message that includes helpful information about basic editing, links to help pages as well as pointers to "offline" communication methods to connect with other Wikipedians. We have a team of editors that looks out for new users and study their pattern of early edits to identify areas of improvements. Once identified, the new user is given a customized message to help him/her resolve these mistakes and improve the quality of their edits. New users are also shown and encouraged to use sandbox initially, reducing the amount of errors in articles. Another distinguishing feature of Marathi Wikipedia is the active effort to increase the awareness about copyrights and related matters. One of the ways Marathi Wikipedia accomplishes this is by using the central notice feature of Mediawiki software to display messages to users.

Taking lessons from German Wikipedia, we have a mentor program in place that provides a new (or not so-new) user with step-by-step instructions on avoiding mistakes/errors seen in their own edits. The mentors also maintain and distribute a list of do's and don't's for Marathi Wikipedia users.

Marathi Wikipedia Projects

We are committed to increase the content on Marathi Wikipedia without losing the quality. The "upcoming article", that has a place on the front page looks to introduce articles that are promising and seeks collaboration from multiple editors to increase their quality. Another initiative is the "52-carat" effort that aims to produce one peer-reviewed article every week. We aim to work on current events and happenings, including sports, elections and other major news.

Public Outreach Programs

Marathi Wikipedia has several online communication avenues, including an active Yahoo group, an Orkut community, a Facebook page and also a Google SMS channel. Day-to-day as well as planning and strategic messaging is disseminated

through these channels along with Wikipedia "village pump" type of pages. We also conduct occasional online campaigns to increase awareness about Marathi Wikipedia among Marathi speaking internet users through these channels.

Marathi wikipedians met on [2010 September 18](#) at Women's Studies Centre, University of Pune. The meetup was attended by 17 wikimedians. We are planning to organize more Marathi wiki meetups and

workshops soon.

Other Wiki Projects

Marathi Wiktionary is slowly growing as it contains set of newly standardized words for computation in Marathi Language finalized by FUEL with support from CDAC. Marathi Wikiquote is growing under new sysop. Marathi Wiki books contains more of source literature like Dnyaneshwari etc.

Current Status

Tamil Wikipedia has crossed 23,500 articles recently. It has more than 20,000 registered users and about 260 of them had contributed actively since the inception of the project. Tamil Wikipedia has a slow but steady growth. However, statistics for recent months show an increased activity. The number of active users in a month has increased almost three fold and the rate of article creation reached 17 per day in 2010 June.

Tamil Wiktionary is one of the largest in its kind and has more than 1,20,000 pages. Recently, Tamil Nadu government, during the World Classical Tamil Conference held in Coimbatore in 2010 June, handed over a CD consisting of thousands of Technical Terms, collected by Tamil Virtual University, for Tamil Wiktionary. Preparation work for uploading these terms are under way.

Wikicheythikal (Tamil Wikinews) experienced a period of inaction for sometime and has been revived in last year, mainly through the untiring efforts of user Kanaga. Sritharan living in Australia.

Wikimoolam (Tamil Wikisource) is also growing. It has about 1100 pages of Tamil source documents.

Article Competition

As part of the World Classical Tamil Conference and Tamil Internet Conference, an article competition was arranged for university and college students in 2010 April. This covered about 3000 institutions all over Tamil Nadu. This was organized through a joint effort between Tamil Nadu state government and Tamil Wikipedians. This is a major breakthrough in Tamil wikipedia outreach activities. Tamil Wikipedia, through this initiative, has been introduced to large number of prospective contributors and had extensive media coverage during this period, which is expected to bring in long term growth to Tamil Wikipedia.

Google Translation Efforts And Tamil Wikipedia

Google is implementing a program for increasing content in smaller Wikipedias by translating articles from English Language Wikipedia. This program covers Tamil Wikipedia too. This project started in mid 2009. There had been lot of concerns about the quality of these articles and the impact of this project on the quality of Tamil Wikipedia. Tamil Wikipedians initiated talks with Google and offered to co-operate with them in an effort to ensure the quality of translated articles.

The effort has seen partial success particularly in creating basic framework that would facilitate better control. The coordination process is still continuing with mixed results. Tamil wikipedians A. Ravishankar (User:ravidreams) and Balasundararaman (User:Sundar) have done a commendable job in this regard.

Wiki Workshops

Tamil Wikipedians took numerous outreach activities in the last 18 months. Wikipedia workshops

were conducted in Chennai, Bangalore, Toronto and Bergen (Norway). During the World Tamil Internet conference held in Coimbatore during 2010 June, they manned Wikipedia awareness stalls and introduced Tamil Wiki projects to people from all walks of life.

Wikimania

In 2010, two proposals for presentations from Tamil Wikipedians have been accepted. First one is **A review of Google Translation Project in Tamil Wikipedia** by wikipedian A. Ravishankar. The second one was titled **A study of Tamil Wikipedia in its Socio-Cultural Background** by Wikipedian R. Mayoaranathan. Mayoaranathan participated in the conference and delivered the presentations. Wikimania was a good opportunity to network with fellow Indian Wikipedians and others.

In Wikimania 2009, Wikipedian Sundar participated on behalf of Tamil Wikipedia and presented a paper on **Tamil Wikipedia: a case study** outlining the growth phases and some highlights of the Tamil Wiki.

Brief History

Telugu Wikipedia was started on 2003 Dec 9 by Venna Nagarjuna renowned for Padma, a system for transforming Indic text between various public and proprietary formats. By the end of 2005, article count touched 110.

In 2005, Telugu wikipedia received a much needed initial thrust after the wikipedians Chava Kiran, Makineni Pradeep, Vyzasatya, Veeven, and Chaduvari (who later spearheaded e-Telugu campaign) joined wikipedia. Vyzasatya planned and executed a project to have stubs for districts and mandals and Telugu movies with the help of a bot and filling in the information with the help of several volunteers from Telugu online community. Chaduvari translated and drafted many of the initial policies. Pradeep wrote scripts to automate many tasks. The article count became 6000 with these efforts. A symbiotic relationship fostered by the telugu blogger-wikipedian members with the larger Telugu online community proved to be a bigger catalyst for Telugu wikipedia's initial growth. The growth gained further momentum, after wikipedians like Kasubabu, Dr.Rajasekhar, Chandrakantha Rao, Ravichandra, Rahamtulla, and Sujatha joined Telugu Wikipedia.

Current Status

As of 2010 August, Telugu wikipedia has more than 45,000 articles. Page views of Telugu Wikipedia for 2010 July was at 1.8 million. This is a growth of over 16% over 2009 July. 2010 February recorded 4.5 Million page views, the largest so far, though the statistic was said to be under reported due to a server bug.

Telugu Wiktionary is also a notable project, with major contribution from Ms. Sujatha. Brown's English-Telugu dictionary was incorporated into Telugu Wiktionary in its entirety using a bot script written by another Telugu wikipedian, Makineni Pradeep.

Advocacy

Wikipedia was promoted through Book fairs at Hyderabad and Vijayawada with active support from e-Telugu organization and the Telugu language media. This generated lot of interest among the general public.

Recent activities to promote Telugu Wikipedia include organizing Telugu Wikipedia academies at educational institutions with hands-on workshop and publishing a web newsletter.

Q3 Results Of Wikipedia Usage

The statistics for Q3 of Wikipedia usage were released recently. They pointed to some surprising trends in the Indian Demographic and Languages.

India ranks at number 15 globally, in terms of Wikipedia page views and edits which is expected for having only 7% internet usage in the entire country, one of the lowest in the first 50 countries on the list. However, India is still the fifth largest viewer of the English Wikipedia. 94% of all Indian Wikimedians view the English Wikipedia, the second largest language group for India after English is Hindi with 0.6% of total views. The viewing trends point at a steady rate of viewer-ship from India registering at 93-95% of total view for the past year.

The edits from India on the English Wikipedia are another story, 70% of edits from India are on the English Wikipedia, and this marks a gradual fall in edits over the past year. The edits were at 81% in Q4 of 2009 but have fallen by almost 10% between the year to 70.3% this Quarter.

The second largest Indian Language that received edits from India was Telugu at 6.6% followed by Tamil at 5.5% and Malayalam at 4.4% of total edits. Of note here is a reversal in trends in Hindi, Malayalam and Marathi, all of which registered a drop in edits this quarter, the largest one in Hindi from 4.8% to 3.3% between the last quarters.

The Visits per language from India is also of note here, besides the 94% of visit that are to the English Wikipedia, no other Indian language registers more than 1% of total Views from India. Hindi leads with 0.6% of total views followed by Tamil and Marathi at 0.3% and 0.2% of total views.

Some of the Key Take-away from this Quarter's Usage Statistics are-

- 94% Indian Wikimedians view the English Wikipedia ahead of any other Indian Language.
- All Indian Language Wikipedia registered less than 1% of total views from India.
- Edits originating from India has been steadily dropping by almost 10% in the last year to the English Wikipedia.
- Edits from India to Indian Languages has increased in the case of Telugu and Tamil but fallen for all other Indian Languages.

NOTE: Statistics on the location of editors and users might be questionable for India because of the manner in which ISPs (private and public) route their systems. Indian editors and users often get shown up as belonging to some other part of the world - due to a non-Indian IP address assigned to them.

...that Telugu Wikipedia is the first Indian Language Wikipedia to release a Newsletter (called "TeWiki Vaartha").

...that Malayalam wiki community is the first Indian wiki community to release an offline version (CD) of wikipedia articles. Also, it is the first non-Latin wikipedia to release a wikipedia CD.

...that Tamil Wikipedian Sundar is the first Indian language Wikipedian to present a paper in Wikimania.
