CORRESPONDENCIA PARTICULAR.

Madrid, 1^o de marzo.
Desde hoy corre por cuenta del Sr. Riera la recaudación de derechos de entradas en todo el reyno. Esta compañía debe muy bien los grandes beneficios que debe producir el contrato estableciendo una buena administración. Por esta razón han puesto a la cabecera de la empresa Mr. Gonzalez Bravo, cintador general en tiempo de la constitución e intendente interino de la provincia de Cordova, que, después fue encerrado durante muchos meses en un calabozo, y sufrió las más grandes vejaciones por el Intendente Morecho.

Nuestros grandes de España están en la mayor agitación, sufriendo en este momento persecuciones a las cuales no habían estado sujetos hasta ahora la primera clase del estado. Hace un tiempo que se nombró una comisión para cobrar los atrasos del derecho de *lanzas y medias armas*, en cuyo recaudo no solo habían sido sacados ni mucha dulzura y negligencia uno que era costumbre cobrar con interés de juros; mas ahora con protesto de la comisión anterior quieren sacar sumas a los grandes de España que ya tienen pagadas; y lo peor es que según propuesta de la misma comisión no se admitirán en lo absoluto para este pago, ni los intereses de falso ni ningún otro papel. Moneda constante ha de llenar los atrasos que hubo en el tiempo de la guerra de la independencia, durante la cual se bien notorio que la mayor parte de las rentas de la gobernación estaban embargadas por los Franceses. Se sabe que solo al ducado de Medina Sidonia reclaman cuatro millones de reales, ya se han habido citaciones, embargos y todo clase de riguros, nunca visto hasta ahora.

La escasez de numerario llega a tal extremo, que en Castilla apenas se da ya una moneda de plata de aste que se venidos pagados a comprar, 6 por el ducado, cambiar productos por productos nacionales como en el principio de las sociedades o como sucede aun en algunas provincias de Africa. Solo el clero no consta en participar la miseria general: no solo no permite se le toque, lo mas mínimo a sus rentas, sino que procura aumentarlas sin escrupulo de que los medios sean o no legítimos.

Entre varios hechos me remiten esta verdad citada el mas paciente y el que ha causado el mayor escándalo. El propietario D. Vicente Vazquez pidió desembarcar en Sevilla, dejando una fortuna de cuarenta mil ducados de reales, que los canónigos de esta ciudad, queriendo el principio de su enfermedad le creyeron, como aver de rapido, pretendieron que los dejado a su alma por heredera universal. Sin embargo de que en un codicilo que lleva el difunto, se trataba de disposiciones testamentarias en que deja manadas considerables favor de un hermano suyo, pobre y con hijos, y como estas disposiciones deben estar en poder del coadjutor, da calumnia empieza en intentar que la iglesia quiere hechar la red y ampararse de todo este caudal. El general Quesada, capitán general de la provincia, y su gobernador de guerra participan sin duda de esas ambiciones de signos pocos que apoyan que al difunto Vazquez murió abinternado. Sin duda di ben ganarlo el hermano particular del difunto...

Acaban de encerrar al duque de la Brana en el convento de la Cabrera, sitiado en medio de un desierto, acusado por la autoridad que tenía con la Sra. Albinia, primera dama de nuestro teatro italiano. La contrata hecha con esta celebre actriz ha sido por consecuencia anulada por el concejo y se la ha intimado la expulsión de sueldo de España. De suerte que estos actos de despotismo y de iniquidad nos van a privar del solo placer que tenemos aquí, precisamente en el momento en que el carmen de males que nos abruma hace buelat más que nunca las distracciones.

NEW YORK, WEDNESDAY (Morning) MAY 19, 1830.

At the Mobile mail arrived yesterday, New York papers to the 28th ult.; Philadelphia to the 31st; and Charleston to the 6th instant. They do not contain any political news of importance.

A short violent gale of wind was experienced at Gibraltar on the 11th, 12th and 13th March from the eastward—several vessels drifted to the opposite shore but received no material damage. It was apprehended that much damage had been done in the Mediterranean—vessels were however at Gibraltar, injured by the gale. A French brig came in entirely damaged.

CONVENTION.—On the 29th April, the House of Representatives resolved itself into Committee of the whole, to consider the bill to amend the constitution of the Union, so as to impose duties on imports, which Mr. Quincy concluded his observations against the measure. Mr. Blair of South Carolina then obtained the floor, when the Committee rose.

Extract of a letter to the Times, dated May 10th, 1830.

"Presuming that it will be acceptable, I proceed to communicate some of the latest intelligence at this place.

We have had a number of wrecks lately; among the latest are the British brig Sappho, from New Orleans bound to Liverpool, with 771 bales of cotton, a French brig Orient, from New Orleans bound to Liverpool, laden with 3600 clouds-hemp, the Spanish ship Polacra Virgin Mother, with 350 bales Havana sugar, bound to Barcelona.

It is reported that the American Colonies, laden with 13000 bales of cotton from New Orleans bound to Liverpool, was beaten by a gale, and lost 1000 bales.

On the 18th in the afternoon the bill was adjourned, and the treaty deposed to Washington by Davy Miller.

A postscript to a letter from Messrs. Stirling, Wright and Co. under date of the 27th ultimo mentions the fact.

COLOMBIA.—We have been favored with the following extract of a letter from gentlemen having the best means of obtaining his information, dictated at Puerto Cabello, Mar 22d, 1830.

Nothing of any real importance has occurred since my respects of the 27th ult., except the passing over of the Battalion Boyaca in the cause of Venezuela, and the appointment of a commanding officer.

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
