By the arrival of the whale ship Mary Anh Capt Bonney, of Fairhaven, at this port last evening, we have received from Rev. Mr. Bozacott, of the Mis-sionary station at Baratonga, the following account of a devastating hurricane by which that place has been visited.

sonary station at Baratonga, the following account of a devastating hieracine by which that place has been vivited.

On the 16th of March, 1946, the Island of Barotonga situated in E. Ion. 150, S. Int. 32 12, was visited by the most dreadful hurricane ever known; there. The sea had been rough with heavy aquals on the 15th—on the 16th the wind was high and the insercuty sinking fast; from 10 P. M. to 3 A. M. of the 17th is blew a perfect hurricane—the rain poured in torrains and the sea overflowed its banks, and went a long way in over the North and East settlements, earrying destruction in its progress. The rain poured—the torrents descended from the mountains, and with the sea, nearly deluged the above two stations. Mr. Bozacott's new house is the only mission house that remains standing.

Mr. and Mrs. Pitman, with their sister, were dragged through the sea, sometimes up to their necks, to a place of safety, where they had to remain exposed to the storm from 11 at might till daylight he next morning. The houses of the natives, with a very liew exceptions, are in ruins. Two handsone stone chaptels, and one stone achool house, all lately erected, were destroyed. Elyward of 250 houses, 11f off which were framed or stone built, and plastered with lime, on one station alone—"Avanta." are destroyed. Thousands of ecoconaut, breadfuit, and other trees were rioped up by the roots, while those suniting are most of them headless, leafters and brancisces.

The work of civilization, which has being gradually increasing for the last 20 years, has received, such a check, that ten years of prosperity would scarcely restore the island to what it was before the storn. No lives were lost, but a severe famine up in prospect, having lost all their food.—New Dedford Mercury, July 31.
