The papers have recouly made public several promines tessamples of this renunciation of moders spiritualism by persons who had for years been ardest believers in its dootrines. Mesers Rawdurs, Harvis, Barriand others have united in forsuwaring spiritualism on various grounds—come affirming that its isochings are evil and tend to evil; others declaring that it is composed of a slight modicum of truth with a copious admirture of falsebood and delusion, while others again denounce it as a stupendous deception from beginning to and. We think the cause of spiritualism will be greatly injured by these assentia, since they are not made by foss and akeptica, but by individuals who have long enjoyed opishrity as among the most gifted of the expounders of this new doctrine.

We are not much surprised at the inclipient decline of spiritualism. It has seemingly accomplished its end in the good order of Providence, and will probably wane and operats by degrees. It has doubtless been productive of some beneath, measurably qualifying a vast amount of harm directly transable to its influence; The chief good derived from spiritualism is the conviction of man's immortality. The carrent notion of a resurrection of the dead at some unknown and remote period gives place to the more definite idea of certual life pontinued without interruption beyond the grave. There are in the world an astonishing number of skep-lites. Some, immersed in mundane carred and pursuits, have rarely, if ever, given the subject a thought; others have reflected as mere naturalists, and in the false pride of self-derived intelligence, have denied revelation and demanded proof of imperishable existence. The incredulity of these classes has been sadly whaken by the developments of spiritualism—for after abstracting the most liberal per centage for importure and hallucination, there still remains indisputable with the still remains indisputation from disembodied spirits. Hence spiritualism so far has had its uses. It may possibly, too, have awakened some callous and dormant consciences, and initiated reform in certain minds so constituted as to be enabled to profit by its teachings.

But we believe most sincerely that the harm it does outweighs this adventitious and constitute mind for its ordinary train of reflection, and the body for its worted pursuits. It asborbs and mosopolizes the feelings and imagination, and thus acts as an unhealthy attendent.

Furthermore, there is strong reason to believe—judging by internal evidence—that when Spiritual communications are real and not actituous, they most commonly emanate from swil beings. Truth and purity are not taught from these sources, but doctrines are disseminated which lead to errors to religion, and the violation of the received canons of ethics. One of these who have recanted Spiritualism avers that for years he was in daily communication with a spirit presumed to be that of his revered mother, yet he is now convinced, from a careful investigation . Is it worth while to encourage m which, even amidst some appare pleams of truth, propagates as many false hoods as the father of lies himself? Is it no and to confine their risearches to legitimate and innocent modes of inquiry? If the silty women and siltier men who practices spiritual iess would read their, Bibles, and commit to life those divine presepts which bid us love tion supremely, and dur neighbor as ourself, they will discover, a more effectual solace against calamity, a more inexhaustible fountain of happiness, and a better grounded faith in their Creator and his love, than any which can be supplied by the doubtful and perilous intercourse with disembodied souls. We say thus much in affectandor and sincerity, believing, as we do, that Spiritualism is not all collusing or self-deception, but that its developments are like Gratiano's conversation—a grain of wheat to a bushel of chaff, and when searched out, hardly worth the finding.
