IMPOSSIBLE STANDARD OF EFFICIENCY

Dr. W. H. Dalrymple in the state university Press Bulletin of recent issue declares war on the dog and advocates his elimination as a war measure.

Is it right or patriotic at this time, then, to continue to feed hundreds, perhaps thousands, of worthless dogs on food that is suitable for human consumption...

The subject is one of too serious a nature at this time to permit sentiment in favor of the cur-dog, to outweigh the urgent necessity for an immediate increase in the people's food and wool supply.

There is, of course, some force to the doctor's indictment against the dog, but not enough to warrant a policy of elimination unless conditions arise in the country which no one now anticipates.

Dr. Dalrymple should not grudge the dog his daily ration of scraps from the table. He earns his daily food, even in war time and many dog owners would prefer to go hungry themselves rather than see their animals suffer.

The estate of the late John Adams Keppel is valued at \$86,189 in a list of assets filed in the civil court yesterday with the application of the heirs to be placed in possession.

Practically all the assets consist of bonds. Of these, \$22,800 represent New Orleans municipal bonds, while the holdings of Louisiana state bonds total nearly \$50,000.

An inventory of the estate of Henry Butker shows that aside from \$113,930 cash the only item is that of life insurance. Two policies, with return premiums, are appraised at \$20,182.
