The efficial statement of the year's and quarter's revenue was published last night. It exhibits, upon the quarter ending yesterlay the decrease compared with the quarter ending April 5, 1840, is 270,514.

The principal sources of revenue which show a decrease are the customs and the post office, the former amounting to 30,1642 pounds, and the later to no less than 833,00. The increase is to be found principally in the excise, which exceeds the last year by 480,599 pounds.

The stamps also have increased £162,722, and the taxe £285,019. The probable amount of Exchequer bills required to meet the charge on the consolidated fund, amounts for the quarter ended April 5, 1841, to 44,317,733.
