Black Cat Cafe in Cambridge, UK is credited with being one of the first cafes in Britain to introduce the antipodean style cafe now becoming so popular particularly in London. It opened in 2006 and was followed quickly by Flat White in London. It is well known for introducing the <u>Flat White</u> coffee so popular with Australians and New Zealanders. It is usually made with a fern leaf swirled into the foamed milk. Black Cat also helped introduce the idea of the weekend brunch and made French toast, bacon, banana and maple syrup a breakfast feature. Black Cat is run by New Zealanders and is famous in Cambridge for its excellent coffee, which they roast themselves, their homemade cakes and good, innovative and changing menu.
