DEPT. OF THE STATE—REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE—FOREIGN CREDITS, &c.

On the 11th of December last, we understood the defense of the Legislature had been struck which was made upon the act of last session, allowing debts to the insolvent Property Banks to pay up their dues to the Committee of Finance.
