ROMAN AQUEDUCTS. They Were Built Because There Were No Suitable Pipes to

Be Had.

People formetful of the real status of mechanical economy in the time of the Romans have often expressed wonder that they built expensive aqueducts when, it is proved, they knew the hydrostatic principle that water rises al-

ways to its own level. The principal reason undoubtedly was that they had no suitable material to make pipes which would stand the enormous pressure inseparable from an underground system. Lead was out of the question for the purpose because the pipes would have to be made so disporportionately the c, and, besides, water flowing for me s through lead would be poisonous. Short lead and clay pipes were weed by them in their cities and houses for the supply of baths, but without cast iron, which they did not possess, they could not have made pipes to carry water long distances. Lastly, the water brought to Rome was strongly impregnated with lime, and this would have caused a great incrustation in pipes and necessitated frequent openings and cleaning, whereas an equeduct, once built, would, as events have proved, last for a very long time with a very moderate amount of repairs.

No Century Begins on Sunday. There are some curious facts about our calendar. No century can begin on Wednesday, Friday or Sunday. The same calendars can be used every 20 years. October always begins on the same day of the week as January, April or July: September as December. Febrnary, March and November begin on the same days. May, June and August always begin on different days from each other, and every other month in the year. The first and last days of the year are always the same. These rules do not apply to leap year, when comparison is made between days before and after February 29.

MEN GET SHORTER.

It Is Said This Happens When They Climb to the Top of High Mountains.

known to all our mountain climbers is that the height of a man is diminished to an extraordinary degree by the time he has reached the summit of a considerable mountain.

So much is this the case that a sixfoot man is actually diminished in height by a full inch by the time he reaches any of the best known of the great Alpine summits, though the usual diminution, produced in very few hours, is three-quarters of an inch.

The extent of this diminishing of height has caused much discussion for some time, but doctors generally attribute it to the peculiar position mostly maintained in climbing. One noteworthy feature is that the more heavily laden the climber may be the greater is the diminution.

Although the height of all men grows less to the extent of three-quarters of an inch, the diminution varies greatly in individuals of the same normal height beyond that extent, and the normal height is not resumed for some hours after the climb.

It Bill Always Proved to Be a Flat Failure Among Back-

ward Races. Anent the proposition to make our newly-acquired dependencies self-governing, it is interesting to note that parliamentary government has invariably proved a flat failure in semicivilized

The negro republics of Liberia and Hayti form the most glaring example; but it would hardly be correct, after all, to describe their government as parliamentary. With the exception of Chili, which, thanks to a very large admixture of English and Scotch blood in its best families, stands far ahead of the rest, nearly all the Central and South American republics are pitiable parodies on popular government. The grossest corruption and incapacity are thinly veiled by paper constitutions and clouds of high-sounding verbiage. In nearly every case they are ruled by political adventurers, who govern really by force, and will rather plunge the country into the horrors of a revolution. than forego the spoils of office. The result of this deplorable state of things is to be found, first, in almost constant turmoils, which are merely faction fights on a huge scale; and, secondly, in the backward condition of the countries, in spite of their very great natural advantages; and in the further fact that, where these advantages are and foreign capital.

BLOOM AND ODOR. A Close Connection Has Been Discovered Between Color and Perfume.

An exhaustive examination of flowering plants reveals that only about ten per cent, of them are odoriferous. The red flowers and those which have combined colorings approximate to this average, while yellow flowers are slightly below it. Of blue flowers only five per cent, are scented, and in those of a violet color the proportion is still farther reduced. White flowers are most odoriferous, 15 per cent, of them being fragrant, and it is a matter of common observation that the white varieties of garden flowers are generally more highly scented than the colored

members of the same species. It has been noted that flowers of & brownish hue have usually a disagreeable smell, and in the case of the stapelian or carrion flowers the cdor is scarcely distinguishable from that of putrescent meat, and proves attractive to those insects which feed on decaying substances. As a rule where the inflorescence is brilliant and conspicuous, perfume is deficient, but many striking exceptions will readily suggest themselves. The perfume, like the coloring of flowers, plays an important part in securing cross fertilization by the agency of insects, and the presence of one attractive factor enables the plant to dispense in many cases with the
