**CHARTER.**

**UNITED STATES OF AMERICA. STATE OF LOUISIANA, PARISH OF ORLEANS, CITY OF NEW ORLEANS.**  
Be it known, That on this twenty-first day of the Month of August, in the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and seven.  
Before me, ERNEST TOURNÉFLORE, a Notary Public in and for the Parish of Orleans, State of Louisiana, duly commissioned and qualified, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named, personally came and appeared the persons whose names are hereunto subscribed, who severally declared that availing themselves of the provisions of the laws of Louisiana, as well as of those of the general laws of the State relative to the organization of corporations, they have formed and organized, and do by these presents form themselves, a corporation for the objects and purposes set forth in the stipulations and agreements hereinafter set forth, which they hereby adopt as their Charter, to-wit:  
**ARTICLE I.**  
The name and title of the corporation hereby formed is declared to be **THE VICTORIA COMPANY**, incorporated under which name it shall have and enjoy corporate succession for the period of ninety-nine years, and shall have and exercise for the purposes of all the powers conferred by law upon corporations, including the power to purchase, lease, sell, mortgage and pledge real and personal property in the prosecution of its business, to contract, sue and be sued, to make by-law for its government and to exercise all the powers necessary or convenient in carrying on its business.  
**ARTICLE II.**  
The domicile of this corporation shall be in the City of New Orleans, Louisiana. All citation or other legal process shall be served on the President of the Company, or in his absence on the Vice-President, or Secretary and Treasurer.  
**ARTICLE III.**  
The objects and purposes for which this corporation is organized and the nature of the business to be carried on by it are hereby declared to be the carrying on of a general crypp and manufaturing and canning of crypp and molasses, and of selling same and other products.  
**ARTICLE IV.**  
The capital stock of this corporation is hereby fixed at One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) divided into One thousand shares of One hundred dollars each, which said shares shall be paid for in cash or its equivalent in real estate, merchandise, or property at the time that the same are issued. All transfers of stock shall be made on the books of said Company as the surrender of the outstanding certificates, pursuant to such rules as shall be prescribed by the Directors. Said capital stock may be increased to the amount of Two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000.00) or may be decreased by proceedings in accordance with the requirements of the laws of this State. Should the said capital stock be increased the existing stockholders shall have the right to take shares of the additional stock in proportion to the number of shares then owned by them within thirty days after the increase shall have been made. This Company shall have the right to commence business when Thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) of the capital stock shall have been subscribed for.  
**ARTICLE V.**  
All the corporate powers and authority of the corporation shall be vested in President, a Vice-President and General Manager, a Secretary and Treasurer, who shall constitute a Board of Directors, and shall be exercised as follows:  
The president shall have the power to conduct the business of said corporation, subject to the control of a two-thirds vote of all the members of said Board; each of said officers shall own in his own name, at least five shares of the capital stock of this corporation, and shall be elected at the annual meeting of the stockholders to be held on the Second Monday in June of each year.  
**ARTICLE VI.**  
All elections shall be by ballot and held at the office of said corporation under the supervision of two commissioners to be appointed for that purpose by the Board of Directors. Each share of stock shall be entitled to one vote to be cast by its owner, either in person or by proxy, and a majority of the votes cast shall elect the corporation and shall not be dissolved by failure to hold an annual meeting and to elect Directors thereat, but in case of such failure the said annual meeting shall be held as soon thereafter as possible. The first annual meeting of the stockholders shall be held on the Fourth Tuesday in August, A. D. 1907. Until the said First annual meeting the Board of Directors of this Company shall be composed of the following persons, to-wit:  
Adolf Dugas, President, Martin G. Woolley, Vice-President and General Manager, Samuel D. Baker, Secretary and Treasurer. Both the directors above named and all thereafter elected shall continue in office until their successors shall have been elected and qualified.  
**ARTICLE VII.**  
Both the stockholders subscribing this charter, and the stockholders hereafter admitted to the stock of this corporation, shall be bound mutually with each other not to stipulate their stock without first giving in writing to the other stockholders three days notice of such intended transfer and allowing each other stockholders to have the privilege of purchasing said stock at the price fixed by the book value, as shown in the preceding trial balance. In case of the purchase of stock by an existing stockholder, they shall acquire the same in the proportion to which they already hold stock in the corporation. If any one of the stockholders declines to purchase the other may purchase in the proportion of their existing holdings.  
**ARTICLE VIII.**  
No stockholder shall ever be held liable or responsible for the debts or debts of this corporation in any further sum than the unpaid balance due to the corporation on the shares owned by him, or shall any mere in formality in organization have the effect of rendering this charter null, or of exposing a stockholder to any liability beyond the amount of his stock.  
**ARTICLE IX.**  
At the termination of this charter by limitation or otherwise, the assets and affairs of this corporation shall be liquidated by three commissioners to be appointed from among the stockholders at a meeting convened after ten days prior notice in writing shall have been given by the Secretary and Treasurer to each stockholder or his duly authorized agent; and the proceeds of such liquidation shall be divided among the stockholders as they are entitled to in the first paragraph of this article.  
This Done and Passed at my office, New Orleans, aforesaid, the day, month and year first above written in the presence of Messieurs Sol. Weiss and L. O. Shackelford, Witnesses, who are admitted to practice in this City, who have signed their names with the said parties and me, the said Notary after the reading of these presents.
