As Interview With Bismarck.
The London Times prints the following account of a conversation between Bismarck and the British Ambassador at Berlin:

Lord A. Lytton July 15.
Berlin, July 15, 1870.—I had an interview with Count Bismarck today, and conversed with him for some time on the subject of the impending crisis in the Franco-German relations.

The interview appeared somewhat doubtful as to whether the solution would be a withdrawal of the French army from the frontier, or a declaration of war.
