Happy New Year

NEW YEAR RESOLUTION

Give yourself, not material gifts, for Christmas and New Year.

Mother Teresa of Kolkata is an example to follow for she gave herself to the poorest among the poor. Christmas means God giving himself to humanity in a way that we could never have thought possible and New Year means living that transformed life with our fellow brethren in and around the society.

What does this self-giving imply?

Undoubtedly it implies that we could surrender a little more of ourselves to other people, to society, to the larger interests of humanity, to the cause of peace, justice, probity in public life, wellbeing of people.

In a world where a person's worth is measured by what he or she owns, it is amazing to think of the Son of God who "emptied himself" and took the form of a servant. There are times when this self-emptying calls for giving up some portion of our personal pride and many things that we consider central to our lives. But most of all it means that we place all our energies, time, talents and all that we are at the service of the Kingdom and the betterment of humanity. It is a challenge to our societies too. Is not some sort of self-emptying needed today: shedding of the attitudes of covetousness, anger, vindictiveness, over-ambition, and deadly competition?

There are days when vested interests of strong

communities and over-assertion of weaker groups collide, when violence and corruption can be noticed at every level of society in various forms. If societies do not feel the need for some sort of transformation, of self-emptying, they will be destroyed by these very forces. We need today people who think about others and the common good, who place themselves at the service of others; bring in amity, understanding, mutual respect, and happy relationships. We begin to understand the meaning of self-giving only by doing it. The joy that this self-gift generates is not easy to describe. And that joy, nobody can take it away from us.

How would you express this idea of self-giving in the context of everyday life?

We have the wonderful example of Mother Teresa who had made a gift of herself to Calcutta's poor and to the poorest of the poor of the world. She did not become less of a person for her self-giving; she grew from day to day until she emerged as a towering personality on the world scene. Even the most powerful on earth bowed to her. The task of the missionary is just the same. It would seem that one has surrendered one's rights over one's time, energy, skills, resources to others in such a way one does not belong to oneself any more, but to the people. They seem to have all rights over us. And one is happy that this is so. We have just concluded the Archdiocesan missionary congress with much fanfare and celebration in Guwahati. The message of the Congress was be the "Light to the World". But it is not a message about self-advertisement. It rather refers to a self-effacing announcement of the One Who is the Light of the World.

Can such words be made meaningful in today's world?

I can never forget an experience I had when I was looking after a hostel of some 160 young people. One day I found a young boy of class seven sitting on a pile of stones in the playground reading a thick book. What was my surprise when I found that he was reading the Bible precisely where it said, "He who follows me will never walk in darkness, he will have the light of life (Jn, 8:12)". I could see that this young 'theologian' of 12 years was wrestling with this idea—the 'light of life'. I felt so small before this Middle School wonder. He was from Arunachal Pradesh and had just accepted the faith. Certain truths that seem logically un-analyzable are intuitively perceived by people who are open to God.

Is there any way that the deeper Christian truths can be made intelligible and acceptable to the people of our day?

In this secularized world, sharing a religious message is becoming more difficult, for sure. However, wherever there is genuineness and relevance, people look up and listen. What people find boring are the things that surround the real truth, not the truth itself, e.g. the personal façade we put up, the unfamiliar vocabulary we use, the inner Church concerns that we are busy with, the inner tensions we reflect, the un-evangelical image that we project. At times, the things that we say do not seem to have any relationship with the world they live in and the thoughts that fill their mind. Jesus began with the life-situation of people, not analyzing ideas. Once they are with you, you may take them to where they are willing to come. But the skill consists in entering into their world of interests and speaking of things that seem to matter to them.

MARY MOTHER OF GOD

As Catholics, we firmly believe in the incarnation of our Lord: Mary conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit. (Lk 1:26-38 and Mt 1:18-25) Through her, Jesus Christ—second person of the Holy Trinity, one-in-being (consubstantial) with the Father, and true God from true God—entered this world, taking on human flesh and a human soul. Jesus is true God and true man. In His person are united both a divine nature and a human nature. Mary did not create the divine person of Jesus, who existed with the Father from all eternity. “In fact, the One whom she conceived as man by the Holy Spirit, who truly became her Son according to the flesh, was none other than the Father’s eternal Son, the second person of the Holy Trinity. Hence the Church confesses that Mary is truly ‘Mother of God’ (*Theotokos*)” (CCC, No. 495). As St. John wrote, “The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us, and we have seen His glory: The glory of an only Son coming from the Father filled with enduring love” (Jn 1:14).

For this reason, sometime in the early history of the Church, our Blessed Mother was given the title “Mother of God.” St. John Chrysostom (d. 407), for example, composed in his Eucharistic Prayer for the Mass an anthem in honor of her: “It is truly just to proclaim you blessed, O Mother of God, who are most blessed, all pure and Mother of our God. We magnify you who are more honorable than the Cherubim and incomparably more glorious than the Seraphim. You who, without losing your virginity, gave birth to the Word of God. You who are truly the Mother of God.”

However, objection to the title “Mother of God” arose in the fifth century, due to confusion concerning

the mystery of the incarnation. Nestorius, Bishop of Constantinople (428-431), incited a major controversy. He stated that Mary gave birth to Jesus Christ, a regular human person, period. To this human person was united the person of the Word of God (the divine Jesus). This union of two persons—the human Christ and the divine Word— was “sublime and unique” but merely accidental. The divine person dwelt in the human person “as in a temple.” Following his own reasoning, Nestorius asserted that the human Jesus died on the cross, not the divine Jesus. As such, Mary is not “Mother of God,” but simply “Mother of Christ” the human Jesus. Sound confusing? It is, but the result is the splitting of Christ into two persons and the denial of the incarnation.

St. Cyril, Bishop of Alexandria (d. 440) refuted Nestorius, asserting, “It was not that an ordinary man was born first of the Holy Virgin, on whom afterwards the Word descended; what we say is that, being united with the flesh from the womb, (the Word) has undergone birth in the flesh, making the birth in the flesh His own...” This statement affirms the belief asserted in the first paragraph. On June 22, 431, the Council of Ephesus convened to settle this argument. The Council declared, “If anyone does not confess that the Emmanuel is truly God and therefore that the holy Virgin is the Mother of God (*Theotokos*) (since she begot according to the flesh the Word of God made flesh), *anathema sit*.” Therefore, the Council officially recognized that Jesus is one person, with two natures—human and divine—united in a true union. Second, Ephesus affirmed that our Blessed Mother can rightfully be called the Mother of God. Mary is not Mother of God, the Father, or Mother of God, the Holy Spirit; rather, she is Mother of God, the Son—Jesus Christ. The Council of Ephesus declared Nestorius a heretic, and the Emperor Theodosius ordered him deposed and exiled. (Interestingly, a small Nestorian Church still exists in Iraq, Iran and Syria.)

NEWS FROM PRISON MINISTRY INDIA-NELLORE UNIT

" Pre-Christmas celebrations were held in the central prison Nellore. Our Bishop M. D. Prakasam was the main guest and in his message to the brothers and sisters behind the bars, he stressed the importance of loving one another and being compassionate to fellow prisoners. All the prisoners enjoyed the cultural program given by the various institutions of Nellore town and the celebration was appreciated by all the Jail authorities. Many priests and nuns took part in this celebration. Thanks to Fr. Y. C. Hrudayaraj, the director of Prison Ministry of India and his team of volunteers for arranging such a wonderful program for the least brothers of our society".

On 19th December the Prison Volunteers team visited the Central Prison in Nellore and celebrated the Pre-Christmas with the prisoners. Our Lordship Bishop M. D. Prakasam was the main Chief Guest for the celebrations. In the absence of Jail Superintendent, the deputy jail superintendent Mr. Ali Khan and Mr. Murali Babu gave us a warm welcome inside the prison. We were about 50 people who went inside to give cultural program for the prisoners behind the bars. The whole program started at 11.15 AM with the inviting the guests on to the dais and followed by the prayer song by the students of St Peter's Boarding Home. After which our Bishop Prakasam

garlanded the statue of Baby Jesus followed by the jail authorities, priests and nuns. As a symbolic gesture we also invited one of the inmates to garland the Baby Jesus and light the candle. Fr. K. B. Victor John, the director of St Peter's boarding home read the bible passage from the Gospel of Mathew. Then St Peter's Boarding Home for boys sang the Christmas hymn. It was then followed by the message from Bishop M. D. Prakasam. Our Bishop spoke on God's love, mercy and compassion. How God was good to us in sending his Son Jesus into this world. He encouraged the prisoners to be nice to each other and to forgive one another and to forget the past life and be renewed persons. Also he told them to be compassionate to one another as Jesus was compassionate towards the needy. Bishop encouraged to them to be cheerful and joyful and complete their period patiently. All the inmates were touched by his message and gave a big round of applause for the Bishop. Then the deputy superintendent Mr. Murali Babu in his message told that we are blessed to be in India, because we have the freedom to practice any religion. Irrespective of caste, color and creed and religion we celebrate all festivals inside the prison, which is a blessing for all of us. Christmas is celebrated all over the world because the message of love is given to everyone. Jesus did so many good things in this world and that's why everyone celebrates Christmas irrespective of caste, creed and religion. Mr. Sudhakar the medical officer of the prison appreciated the message given by the Bishop and told the gathering that we should be happy that we were born as humans. He also mentioned that our life span is very short and that we should try to do good to others. Jesus touched and cleansed the lepers which no one did. He gave sight to the blind and helped the needy in their distress. After all the messages, our Youth Center students performed wonderful dance under the guidance

The children of Vianney Home gave the prisoners much joy by their variety entertainment. They brought lot of laughter, joy and happiness by their program. It was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone that was present there. Thanks to Sr. Shirley of Holy Cross and her team for preparing such a beautiful program. The boys and girls from St Peter's High school performed dance on environment and about problems that exists in the society which was done beautifully. Thanks to Mrs. Ramadevi and Mr. Chaitanya who coached them. The students of St Joseph's college of Nursing entertained the gathering with their dance for a Hindi Song which was enjoyed by the gathering. Thanks to Sr. Cecili (JMJ) the principal for allowing them. The minor seminarians from Sunnabhupatti entertained the gathering with their dance on Christmas theme. Thanks to Fr. K. Balraj and his associate for bringing and preparing them for the program. After enjoying thoroughly the inmates were so taken up and praised and thanked the PMI for providing such a wonderful celebration for them. prison. After the cultural program the PMI gave the inmates sweets and fruits in view of Christmas. At this Juncture I would like to thank our DNSSS and its director Fr. Alphonse for having come forward to donate sweets for our brothers and sisters behind the bars. I also thank Sr. Allam Showrilu and her community for donating the fruits for the inmates.
