General John M. Morgan killed in East Tennessee and his Field and Escort captured.

The following was yesterday received by Major General C. S. Cooley, commanding Military Division West Mississippi:

Bayou Safa, Morganza, Sept. 9, 1864. —

I have so learned through reliable sources that General John M. Morgan, who was killed in East Tennessee, and his Field and Escort captured. This is reliable.

Various Confirmations of the Capture of General John M. Morgan. —
Reported Killed at Morganza, Va., on Saturday, Aug. 25, 1864, toward Chattanooga. —
Morgan's Campaign the Shenandoah-Early
in Virginia, and the Valley, including the
Harrisburg, Petersburg, and Lynchburg
and 100,000 men. — Men to
attack the South. — The Tabularum, or
The Edge Proceedings, and Advance-
ment of the Edge, Conventions, Pro-
tection of Slave, etc., were pre-
