SUBJECT: (S) Transfer Recommendation for Guantanamo Detainee, Abdur Raziq, ISN: US9PK-00099DP

- 1. (S) **Personal Information**: Abdur Raziq is a Pakistani national born in 1972 (age 30) in Kot Marakand Agency, Pakistan. Detainee is in good heath.
- 2. (FOUO) **Detention Information**: On 27 July 2001, subject detainee traveled from the Tablighi Jamiat headquarters in Raiwind, Pakistan to Meymaneh, Faryab Province, Afghanistan to perform missionary work supported by Tablighi Jamiat. Upon recruitment into Tablighi Jamiat, detainee received four months of training, consisting of travel to nearby towns in Pakistan, preaching, and discussing the six principles of Tablighi Jamiat. Once training was complete, a group of seven elders within Tablighi Jamiat assigned detainee to a region to work as a missionary based on his financial capabilities. Recruits were responsible for providing their own traveling expenses. On 11 November 2001, Northern Alliance forces apprehended detainee while he sat in the Tan Durak Mosque in Meymaneh, Afghanistan. Detainee was transferred to U.S. forces in December 2001 and subsequently transported to Guantanamo Bay Naval Base, Cuba on 25 June 2001 because of his knowledge of hostilities in Kabul, Mazar-e Sharif, and Meymaneh and on the Tablighi Jamiat organization. Detainee has been cooperative, but Joint Task Force Guantanamo considers the information obtained from and about him as neither valuable nor tactically exploitable.
- 3. (S) Assessment: Based on current information, detained ISN: US9PK-00099DP is assessed as being neither affiliated with al-Qaida nor a Taliban leader. Moreover, based on the detained folder, the knowledgeability brief, and subsequent interrogations by JTF Guantanamo, the results of which are available on the JTF Guantanamo detained database, the detained has no further intelligence value to the United States and will not be seen for further intelligence purposes. Subject detained has not expressed thoughts of violence or made threats toward the U.S. or its allies during interrogations or in the course of his detention. Based on the above, detained does not pose a future threat to the U.S. or its interests.
- 4. (S) **Recommendation**: In view of the foregoing, I recommend subject detained be considered for transfer or release to the control of another government.
