HAPPENINGS 69 YEARS AGO.

Gen. Taylor is in New Orleans.

The enthusiasm exhibited in his re-
ception reflected equal honor on the war-worn soldier and a great people. The ceremonies attending his entrance are too publicly known to need an attempt at description. We look upon his arrival at this peculiar period as an auspicious augury. Two years since a comparatively obscure individual, he proceeded to our southern frontier and against fearful odds bore the standard of our country from victory to victory; excited the admiration of the world, and solved the problem whether a republican form of government was as well calculated for efficiency in war as the promotion of prosperity and peace.

But not alone by his military achievements has he won the hearts of his countrymen. His simplicity, purity, candor, independence, firmness and unostentatious benevolence stand out in bold relief against the intrigue, arrogance, corruption and unblushing effrontery of the day; and mark him as distinctly as the brilliancy of his battles. No heart-sickening disappointments have soured his spirit and alienated his affections from half his countrymen; no tortuous course of policy has marked his career; no ranking hatred of political opponents stands with his motives or impels his actions; no previous course of erroneous policy has induced the necessity of persisting in error to avoid the charge of inconsistency; no cher-

lished, hopes of preferment has been blasted; no petty political malice has to gratify; no horde of sycophantic vermin await his elevation that they may bathe in the spoils of the people. But invested with all the attributes which "may become a man", and endeared to his countrymen by his virtues, if the South be true to herself he returns to dissipate the gloom which now shrouds the political firmament. Recent events have placed him in a still more prominent position before the people; his feelings, sympathies and affections are with the South; and if we would guard against violent sectional dissensions, the danger can only be averted by his elevation to the presidency.

Discovery in Mississippi.

In the southwestern part of Franklin county, Miss., there is a platform on stone composed of hewn stone, neatly polished, three feet under the ground. It is about 108 feet long, and 40 feet wide. It extends due north and south, and its surface is perfectly level. The masonry is said to be equal, if not superior, to any work of modern times. The land about it is cultivated, but thirty years ago it was covered with oak and pine trees, measuring from two to three feet in diameter. It is evidently of remote antiquity, as the Indians who reside in the neighborhood had no knowledge of its existence previous to its recent discovery. Nor is there any idea of the people who were its builders.

Curious marriage contract.

In the Royal Library of Paris is a written contract, drawn up in 1297, between two persons of noble birth in Armagnac. The document bound the husband and wife to faithful wedlock FOR SEVEN YEARS. It is stipulated that the parties should have the right to renew the tie at the end of that time if they mutually agreed; but if not, the children were to be divided, and if the number should chance not to be even, they were to draw lots for the odd one.

Mexican barbarity.

An officer writing from Mexico, thus describes what he witnessed on entering the capital: "On marching into the city on the morning of the 14th, I saw one of our men who had been taken prisoner the day before, stripped naked, tied to a board, head and feet, his hands tied over his chest, the flesh from the chest flayed off and his heart cut out. In this condition he was laid in the street to greet our arrival. Such are the barbarians we are among."

l'opposition immédiatement la retraite du ministère et la formation d'un cabinet, dans lequel seraient représentés les différents partis politiques. Cette combinaison n'a, paraît-il, que peu de chances d'aboutir, les socialistes se refusant, en principe, à en faire partie. Au sénat américain, il s'est parallèlement dessiné, surtout à raison de l'élevation du prix, une opposition, qui entendra aujourd'hui même les explications demandées à M. Lansing.

Le Parlement de Copenhague se prononce donc déjà, sous une forme encore indirecte il est vrai, sur l'initiative gouvernementale. Mais la question peut-elle être tranchée par le Parlement actuel? La Chambre haute dit que non, en se basant évidemment sur ce fait qu'en juin, 1915, le Danemark s'est donné une constitution nouvelle qui accorde le droit de vote aux femmes, et la Chambre a décidé d'en retarder l'application jusqu'à la fin de la guerre. Enfin, il faudra également une nouvelle consultation de la population des Antilles. Le peuple danois à toujours revendiqué pour les Schleswicois annexés, le droit de se prononcer sur leur sort, conformément à l'article 5 du traité de Prague de 1863, et il estime que la population d'une des seules colonies a droit au même traitement. Les îles dont il s'agit sont au nombre de trois: Saint Jean, Saint Thomas et Sainte Croix et comprennent un chiffre total d'environ 36.000 habitants. La transaction prépare entre les gouvernements de Washington et de Copenhague devra subir, comme on le voit, quelques épreuves avant de devenir définitive. Elles ajoutent de l'intérêt à cette aliénation éventuelle de territoire par un accord mutuel, au moment où, par la force des armes, la carte du monde va subir des remaniements considérables, dont le Danemark lui-même peut espérer la réparation d'une mutilation qu'il a subie, il y a près d'un demi-siècle.
