Mitchell and team out to floor them in London

A glaring omission from the Australian Olympic Team's trophy cabinet is a medal in women's artistic gymnastics – but the five athletes selected today to compete in London are determined to fix that.

The Australian team heads to London with the best credentialed team in history and the hopes of the nation will be behind them.

Leading the team will be Australia's first ever female gymnastics World Champion, Lauren Mitchell.

"It's really exciting to have the opportunity to compete at my second Olympic Games and I'm thrilled to be heading to London with the team," Mitchell said.

"I'm really looking forward to the atmosphere in London. When I competed in 2009 at Worlds it was really enjoyable so I'm looking forward to heading back and doing Australia proud."

Not only did Mitchell compete at the Olympic venue in 2009 – she excelled, winning two silver medals on the beam and floor.

Mitchell, who will turn 21 just before the Games, is currently training with her teammates at the Australian Institute of Sport in Canberra before heading to London in a few weeks time.

"Training wise I am focusing more on quality," she said. "Peggy is introducing distractions to get us used to the Olympic arena and test our ability to ensure we can perform to our best."

Head Coach Peggy Liddick couldn't be happier with the team she has assembled for London and is confident in the ability of all five of the athletes to perform at the Games.

"Each of the athletes selected presents different strengths that we'll now be working on to refine our consistency and deliver a strong competition come London," Liddick said.

"We need to ensure we can deliver consistent routines to achieve the scores and ensure finals berths at the games. Our main aim is to maintain sixth place achieved at the last Olympics as well as underpinning our chances to support individual athletes to achieve podium finishes."

Competing alongside Mitchell will be Beijing Olympians Georgia Bonora and Ashleigh Brennan as well as Olympic debutants Emily Little and Larrissa Miller.

"We've selected a mixed team of three dual Olympians and two who will be new to the Olympic competition," Liddick said. "The three dual Olympians will bring maturity and knowledge to the team, giving us a strong advantage heading to London."

"The selection process was a difficult one as the caliber of athletes to select from was extremely high. The final twelve all competed at a high level through the second round trial with a new standard being set."

In determining the final five athletes to represent Australia, the nomination committee considered performances at last week's second round Olympic Nomination trial, the Australian Gymnastics Championships as well as performances in training and past international competitions including the 2011 World Championships.

Women's artistic gymnastics will take place at North Greenwich Arena with qualifications starting on Day 2 of the Games, 29 July.
