tioned in her petition, and the Slaves and cattle

therein described, viz: One arpent of land front

to the river by eighty in depth, a negro man

named Alexis, a negro woman named Mariane,

with her child named Louise, a horse of a cinna-

mone colour, and a bull with a young ox. And

lastly, it is ordered that the Defendant pay costs.
