PUBLIC SCHOOLS. THE Regents of the Central and Primary schools having considered a healthy, commodious, and convenient situation for the upper primary schools, have the pleasure of announcing to the public that it is, this day, referred under the care of Doctor J. M. Bismont, principal, and J. Duval assistant, of the Baptist Church, Lafayette Street.

The lower primary school, under the care of Mr. Deon, principal, and J. B. assistant, of the Central school, under the care of Messrs. M. J. principal, P. P. et al. de la paroisse St. Pierre, professeurs, continue de se tenir, in the Convent of Ursulines, St. Louis Street.

In the Primary Schools are taught: Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, Geography, and the Elements of Grammar the Elements of Languages.

In the Schools are taught: the English Language, Latin, of Greek, Mathematics, Literature; the Elements of Philosophy; &c. The Schools are established to the establishment of a school under the direction of the Board of Regents.

In the Primary Schools:—For tuition in book keeping, two dollars per month; in the Central school; for tuition in any or all of the branches taught in the school and which the pupils is capable of pursuing, three dollars per month. Books and Stationery furnished by the pupils or charged separately.

In each of the schools one hundred pupils unable to pay for their education are admitted and taught gratis. Application may be made to the principals of the several schools, the Secretary of the Board of Regents or the Mayor of the City.
