London, March 30. We have received the Paris papers of Sunday, and letters of Sunday eveening. In the papers there is little news, but the deficiency is made up for by reports and speculations. Le Temps tells us that a meeting has been held, at the house of Prince Polignac, of the French Ministers and the Ambassadors of Great Britain, Austria and the Netherlands, at which it was agreed that in the event of any commotion in France, the three Powers in question should send troops to the assistance of the Royal Family. Our correspondent, alluding to this statement, assures us that it is utterly without foundation-which we can readily believe. The non-interference principle has been too strongly laid down by the British Government as the basis of its conduct, for us to interfere to support any particular dynas ty; the state of the Netherlands is not such as to enable the government of that country to send forces to the aid of Francs; and there is not so cordial an understanding at this moment between the French and Austrian cabinets as to make it probable that Austria would volunteer this kind of assistance. The whole story is purely one of invention.
