On Saturday, Oct. 5, 1850, the Bee published a series of articles under the heading "Turns of the Bee," which were critical of the administration of President Fillmore. The editor of the Bee, John H. Hartranft, was a member of the Whig party and had been a strong advocate of the Compromise of 1850. He believed that the administration was failing to protect the rights of southerners and was supporting the Fugitive Slave Act. The articles caused a stir in the city and led to a public protest by the Whig party.
