FIFTH LEGISLATURE - 1st Session JOURNAL OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Monday, Feb. 16, 1835.

The House met, agreeably to adjournment. Mr. Davidson offered the following resolutions: Resolved, That our representatives in Congress be requested, and our senators be instructed, to use their best exertions to procure a grant of land to assist in making a rail road from Springfield to the parish of Livingston, to Liberty, in the State of Missouri. ... On motion, ordered that said bill do pass and retain its title.

Second Readings. The following bills were read for the second time, and ordered for a third reading on to-morrow: An act to provide for a change of venue in criminal cases. An act relative to successions. An act to amend an act entitled 'an act relative to the voluntary surrender of property, and to the mode of proceeding, as well for the direction as for the disposal of delinquent estates, and for other purposes, approved 20th Feb. 1817.' ... On motion, ordered that said bill do pass and retain its title.

The clerk was directed to request the concurrence of the senate in said bill. The bill entitled 'an act to provide for ascertaining and fixing the boundary lines of adjoining parishes, and for other purposes.' ... On motion, ordered that said bill do pass and retain its title.

The house took up the bill entitled 'an act to establish an additional election precinct in and for the parish of Point Coupee.' ... On motion, ordered that said bill do pass and retain its title.
