CITY AND STATE NEWS IN BRIEF

An important move towards the commercial development of New Orleans and Louisiana was made Wednesday morning when the meeting convened at the Association of Commerce to discuss the routing of the intercoastal canal from Lake Charles west, and to insure a delegation to the Corpus Christi conven-

tion on the 22nd instant, invited the special congressional committee on rivers and harbors to make a trip of inspection over the proposed route in Louisiana. The special committee, leaving Washington on its tour shortly, is due in New Orleans November 14, where it is coming for the purpose of studying harbor facilities.

More than 80,000 needle articles have been sent to the people of France by the Secour Louisianais. Approximately \$1,500 has been collected from donations and entertainments within the last few months, and this money has been devoted to aiding the French.
