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Mr. Hoffman presented an amendment to the Atchafalaya railroad and banking company, being a section transcribed from the bill lately passed to incorporate a similar company.

Mr. Thomas moved for the reconsideration of the bill authorizing an interchange of riders between the 3d and 5th, and of the 4th and 2d districts yesterday passed.

Mr. Moore considered the amendment as unjust, if considered in a geographical view. There are some districts so peculiarly situated, on account of water courses and the common occurrence of inundations, that it is impossible at some times to hold a court.

Mr. Thomas thinks the reasons assigned by the member from St. Helena may be good for opposing the bill; but not for its being reconsidered, nor against the amendment in its present shape.

Mr. Hoffman spoke at length on the amendment, showing the delays and injury which the plaintiffs would sustain when the defendant (by the former section of the bill) would have to pay only legal interest for the use of the money or debt withheld by an injunction.
