Royal Navy makes port call in Guantanamo

A Royal Navy ship patrolling the North Atlantic and the Caribbean made a port call to Naval Station Guantanamo Bay, Cuba Aug. 22.

The 80 civilian-manned British Royal Fleet Auxiliary (RFA) ship Wave Ruler arrived at the Naval Station to resupply with food and fuel before departing on Aug. 26.

The RFA Wave Ruler is one of 16 resupply and logistics ships belonging to the civilian-manned RFA Service with just over 2000 personnel, operating worldwide in support of the British Armed Services, primarily serves the Royal Navy.

The Wave Ruler conducts maritime patrols working with various agencies such as the U.S. Coast Guard, local defense and police forces and many Caribbean nations focusing on countering drug trafficking in the Caribbean region.

“The presence of the Wave Ruler in the Caribbean is a brilliant example of the U.S., U.K. cooperation in the counter narcotics role,” said Capt. Nigel A. Budd, RFA Wave Ruler’s commanding officer. “We have 11 members of the U.S. Coast Guard on board. When we are at sea, they will carry out counter narcotics operations.”

Budd said that having the Coast Guard service members onboard makes it effective for counter narcotics operations because they are able to make arrests under U.S. law.

The Naval Station’s strategic location in the Caribbean enables it to provide supply and logistics support to U.S. Naval and allied ships, such as the RFA Wave Ruler.

“We give fuel to U.S. ships, U.K. ships and NATO ships while in the Caribbean,” said Budd. “In order to do that, we have to top off fuel somewhere and Guantanamo Bay is the ideal place for us to come in and take the high quality F-76 (ship propulsion fuel) that is required for the ships that we replenish.”

The Naval Station provided the Wave Ruler with 1.7 million gallons of F-76 fuel.

According to Budd, Naval Station GTMO is the only source in the Caribbean able to supply the large quantity of F-76 they need.

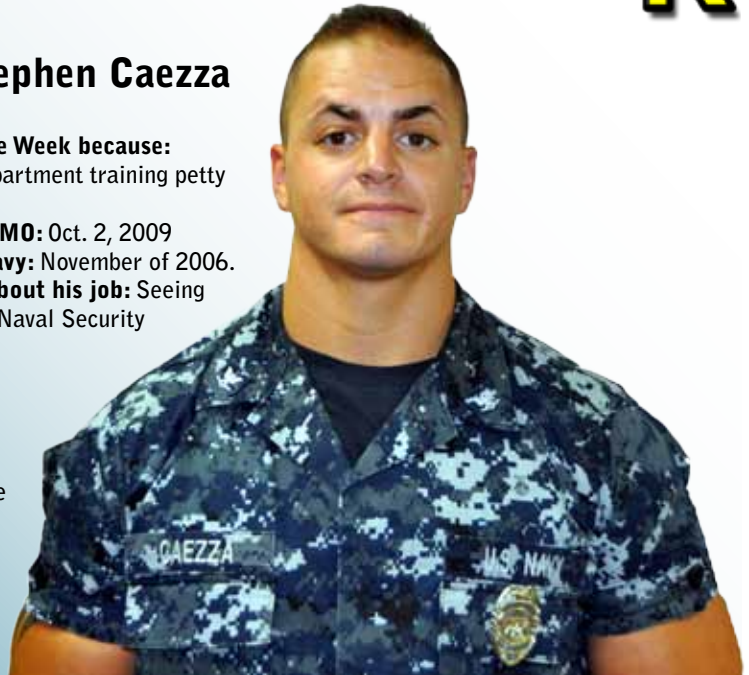

Julian A. Romero, a Cuban Special Category Resident, passed away on Tuesday, August 17, 2010 at the Naval Hospital Guantánamo Bay, Cuba. Born on January 9, 1928, in Central Chaparra, Oriente and resided a long time in Guantanamo City. He lived a full life, passing away peacefully at the age of 82.

Mr. Romero first came to work on the base in 1959 and worked at the Fire Department as a Fire Captain until he retired after 25 years of service. He then worked for a short time at the Navy Exchange.

Mr. Romero was well known for his musical talent. - Fill out a fund raiser approval request form.
- If food is involved, stop by the Naval Hospital first and receive the paperwork from preventative medicine.
- If there will be 25 people or more gathered in one place, you must notify security at 4105.
- Once your fund raiser is approved, you

- will be notified by the CJA's office.
- Reserve a location for your approved fund raiser.
- The NEX Atrium - call Sariah Lucas at 74115;
- MWR Facility – submit written request to the MWR office in building 760;
- Other authorized facility.

2010-2011 school year to kick off with new principal

When the 2010-2011 school year begins for the students of W.T. Sampson Schools, it will be under the leadership of a new principal.

Sonja Rodriguez, an educator for 22 years, transferred to Guantanamo from Yokosuka Middle School in Yokosuka, Japan.

Rodriguez began her career as an elementary school teacher with the Killen Independent School District in Texas. Then, in 1998, she began working for Department of Defense Education Activity as a middle school teacher in Schweinfurt, Germany.

There are approximately 235 students enrolled at W.T. Sampson this school year, attending the Sure Start program, elementary, middle, and high school.

The small number of students and the staff's reputation as professional educators are reasons that Rodriguez said she requested W.T. Sampson Schools.

"Educators in a small, unit-school setting are fortunate to experience the entire curriculum, from Sure Start through high school graduation," she said. "While our student population is transient, we see the entire scope of a child's education."

During her time at GTMO, Rodriguez said she will continue to focus on highest student achievement so that the students receive a "top-notch", quality education.

Without the Naval Station, the ship would have to travel either to 514 miles to Miami, Fla., or 1,170 miles to Norfolk, Va.

Budd said his ship can reach Guantanamo Bay within a day and a half from anywhere in the Caribbean.

"It's centered in the Caribbean and so flexible that we can come in, as we did this time, with a day's notice," he said. "We called up late on a Friday afternoon, the guys here got the emails sent on a Saturday morning and we came in on a Sunday morning."

While in port, the ship also received engineering support from the Naval Station to help unlock a secured safe that could not be opened.

"Security is vitally important and if you have a safe with secured items and you can't get at it, it's not much good for you," said Bud. "That sort of engineering support is great."

For Ralph Densmore, Naval Station GTMO's Physical Security Officer and Pernell J. Pelican, JTF-GTMO's Facility Security Officer, it was an opportunity to work on British safe combination lock systems that are different than U.S. made safe combination locks.

"I have never worked on a British lock until this week, so it was a wonderful experience," said Densmore. "It comes with the job I have here at the Naval Station; I love to assist people with problematic issues."

Pelican, who also assisted in repairing the safes, said a training instructor at Ft. Meade told him that the UK made some of the best mechanical locks in the world.

"Having an opportunity to work on such an intricate lock is the equivalent of an once-in-a-lifetime experience for a locksmith on GTMO," he said. "The British personnel were overjoyed and thankful for the outcome."

While the ship was receiving supplies and engineer support, many of its crewmembers found time to relax and participate in recreational activities around the base.

"It's easy to get everywhere, because there is transport everywhere," said Able Seaman Roxy Challinor, who works in Communications Information Systems. "The bowling is quite good and it's cheap."

Program funding spouse education to be re-instated

From the Navy College Office

When will MyCAA be reinstated?

Monday, October 25, at 8 a.m. (EDT).

Why Oct. 25?

The date was chosen to allow time to implement the new staffing and software infrastructure.

Why did it take so long to re-open the program?

We wanted to make sure we got it right, especially because of financial issues the government is facing.

Why weren't these guidelines incorporated into the program before?

We recognize that this was a shortfall and have taken corrective action.

How do I know the program won't be have more problems?

We believe the new constraints will keep costs in check. We have also reviewed the entire MyCAA program and have instituted additional controls and forecasting tools to better anticipate future demand. We will now monitor program utilization more frequently (daily) with our additional metrics. These include number of spouses creating financial assistance documents, funds obligated, number and type of career field (that is, certificate or degree). Before the pause, we monitored the program on a daily, weekly and monthly basis.

What is the new MyCAA budget?

We have reprogrammed funds to meet the needs of the program for fiscal year 2010; estimated at \$215 million.

What is the budget for the out years and how do you plan to fund it?

The estimated cost for FY-2011 is \$250 million; we anticipate lower costs in the out years. This is still a very new program and consequently, we lack sufficient long-term experience and historical data to formulate a refined budget estimate. We will be monitoring the program closely in FY-2011.

Will the budget be cut?

Not in FY 2011. However, in coming years, with a reduced defense budget a reality, every program will be closely scrutinized for its contribution to military family readiness.

How many military spouses are currently enrolled in the program?

136,583 military spouses have accounts in the program; approximately 110,000 spouses have been approved for financial assistance.

Have spouses failed courses? How much has DoD lost as a result of failed courses? What was the course of action then? What is the course of action now?

Yes. As a result of the course failures and withdrawals, the Defense Department will not realize any benefit from approximately \$6.6 million in funds that were spent on these failures. Under the new guidelines, spouses will have to show successful completion of a course in order to continue in the program.

How long may spouses participate in the program?

Three years, as long as the spouse's sponsor remains active-duty.

What other programs are available for military spouses?

There are a wide variety of federal, state, local, and Service programs for military spouses. To assist military spouses in their search for resources and programs, Military OneSource has developed an in-depth list of federal, scholarship and grant providers.

Where can military spouses go for advice and counseling?

Military OneSource, online at www.militaryonesource.com, is the best place for military spouses to start getting information. Military OneSource Spouse Education and Career Consultants can provide education and training, career exploration, assessment, employment readiness and career search assistance.
