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PROCLAMATION.

Governor of the State of Louisiana.

Whereas, the Legislature of the State of Louisiana, by an act of the United States, for the benefit of the Southern Congress, to serve for two years ensuing, the third day of March, on thousand and eight hundred and thirty-five, are required by law to be elected on the first Monday of July next, and the two following days to wit:

One Representative to the twenty-fourth Congress, to be chosen in the first Congressional District, composed of the counties of Orleans, German Coast, Acadia and Lafourche.

One Representative to the twenty-fourth Congress, to be chosen in the second Congressional District, composed of the counties of Iberville, Point Coupee and Feliciana.

One Representative to the twenty-fourth Congress, to be chosen in the third Congressional District, composed of the counties of Assumption, Opelousas, Rapides, Natchitoches, Ouachita and Concordia.

And where as it is provided by law, that on the day aforesaid, there shall be elected one Senator from each of the following Senatorial Districts, to serve for the term of four years, to wit:

One Senator from the second Senatorial District, comprising within the county of Orleans, One Senator from the county of East Baton Rouge, One Senator from the county of Point Coupee.

One Senator from the county of Feliciana, One Senator from the county of Assumption, One Senator from the county of Natchitoches, and One Senator from the county of Ouachita.

And whereas it is also provided by law, that on the said first Monday in July next, as the two following days, the Representatives to the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, shall be elected and chosen to serve for the term of two years, throughout the State, in the following manner:

The Representative to be chosen in the Parish of Plaquemines.

The Representative to be chosen in the Parish of St. Bernard.

Seven Representatives to be chosen in the Parish of Orleans.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of Jefferson.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of St. Charles.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of St. John.

Two Representatives to be chosen in the Parish of St. James.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of Ascension.

Two Representatives to be chosen in the Parish of Assumption.

Three Representatives to be chosen in the Parish of Iberville.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of Terrebonne.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of Feliciana.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of West Baton Rouge.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of Point Coupee.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of Concordia.

Three Representatives to be chosen in the Parish and County of Natchitoches.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of Catahoula.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of Rapides.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of Avoyelles.

Three Representatives to be chosen in the Parish and County of Natchez.

Two Representatives to be chosen in the Parish of Lafayette.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of St. Martin.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of St. Mary.

Four Representatives to be chosen in the Parish of East Baton Rouge.

Two Representatives to be chosen in the Parish of West Feliciana.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of Washington.

The Representative to be chosen in the Parish of St. Helena.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of Livingston.

One Representative to be chosen in the Parish of Tangipahoa.

As it is provided by the Constitution of this State, that the people entitled to vote for Representatives shall vote for a half over, at the time and places of voting for Representatives and Senators, to continue in office for the term of four years.

Now therefore I have thought proper to issue this my proclamation, notifying the electors and qualified voters throughout the State, that the said election, for the election of the Governor, Judges, Sheriff, and other officers mentioned above, to hold the said election, for the election of the Governor, Senators and Representatives aforementioned, on the said first Monday in July next, and the two following days, within their respective Districts, Counties and Parishes aforesaid, and to cause the same to be conducted, and the returns thereof to be made in the manner, as I think the time provided by law.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the State, at the City of New Orleans, this seventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and of the Independence of the United States, the fifth eighty.
