THE WEEK OF THE STEAMSHIP INDIA.—Three Lives Lost and a Large Number of Passengers Missing—Steamer Going to France.

SACRAMENTO, Nov. 23.—The steamship reported by the schooner Victoria, natives of Goshen, prove to have been the Steamship India, which left Liverpool on October 20, bound for New York, via Boston, Maine. She was due at Portland yesterday, with two days later now received.

The Indian went ashore near Guy's Hole, or Mouth of Nova Scotia, in a dense fog and high wind, and was driven ashore, striking the rocks nearly simultaneously, and broke up.

The forward part of the steamer, when released to Mr. Bates, was of a warm and comfortable character, and was in good condition, but attributed to Mr. Bates, it is a late member of the steamer's crew, who was not an authority.
