ENGLAND.
The Britannia mail ship sailed for Gallipoli with 4000 stand of arms, gunpowder, &c. General Quinlan departs soon for the same port, and his brother has already arrived and commenced his operations.

LATER FROM ENGLAND.

FRANCE.
