**Business's Proposed Canal.**—A resolution has passed the House of Representatives of the United States, directing the committee on Internal Improvements to prepare into the expediency of creating an examination to be made of the coast, east of the Mississippi, at the point near Baton Rouge, and the isthmus dividing the Gulf from the Mississippi. This examination is to be made with a view of ascertaining the practicability of the ship canal, connecting the waters of the Gulf with those of the river.
