The day's collection, bringing Liverpool date of the 2nd of October, had arrived at New York. The dates are not quite as late as those received by way of Halifax; but the news is more ample. We copy a variety of articles from our files of London papers, received by this arrival.

New York is abandoned by the opposition papers including the Courier and Enquirer. In every county that has been heard from, except one, the Jackson ticket has obtained the majority.

Sixty-six towns in New Hampshire give 9272 votes for the Jackson Electors, and 5176 for the Anti-Jackson. Forty-one towns in Maine give 8346 for Jackson, and 7013 for anti-Jackson.
