The following is the address of Judge Casanova to the Grand Jury upon their re-assembling:—

Gentlemen of the Grand Jury:— After a vacation of four months you were again called upon to discharge duties which are both solemn and grave. It is with pain, that I feel myself under the necessity of informing you, that I have so short a period as the one state you have met, there have been committed great violations of our laws.

There is a time, gentlemen, when the administrators of justice had nothing to do but to punish the infractions of those unfortunate belonging to that class of society, from whom nothing but the opposites of social virtues could be expected. But, now, an unhappy change has operated upon our families, upon individuals who have for a long time enjoyed your esteem and your friendship, it is against them that those accusations are brought.

Gentlemen, I cannot recommend to you too often to forget all feelings of friendship or hatred. The information you are brought before you, may have committed great crimes, but remember that they are men, and are still entitled to your pity. Your duty does not limit itself to this, gentlemen, you should also notify the attorney general not only of the crimes that may come to your knowledge, but likewise of all acts that may have an evil tendency upon society.
