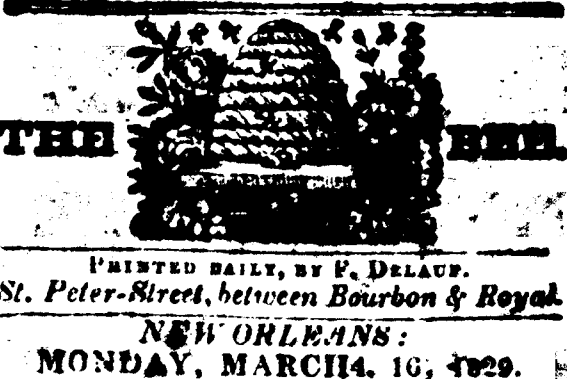

Population of Pennsylvania-The Phil. Sentinel of Saturday contains the returns of the taxable inhabitants of the State of Pennsylvania, in 1821, and also in 1820.

In 1821 the number of deaf and dumb was 485; in 1820, 464; being a decrease of 21.

In 1821 the number of slaves was 224 in 1820, 216; being a decrease of 8.

Imprisonment for Debt.-In the State of New-York, a laboring man, not worth one cent, and owing one cent, is liable to be confined in prison during life, by his creditor, without food, nothing but a plank to sleep upon, and in a cell, without the use of a yard.

At a meeting held on the 9th inst. at Tammany Hall, a few individuals agreed to collect some facts during the week, relative to imprisonment for debt and report the same place at an adjourned meeting, to be held at the same place on Sunday evening, 15th inst. at 7 o'clock, P. M.

During the last three years, 3285 persons have been imprisoned for debt in the city of New-York. During three successive months of the same period, January, February, and March, 1827, one hundred and thirty five persons were imprisoned on executions; of which sixty-three were for sums less than twenty dollars; and twenty-four cases for sums less than ten dollars.
