The Regents of the Central and Primary schools having procured a healthy, commodious, and central position for the upper primary school have the pleasure of announcing to the public, that it is, this day, reopened under the care of Doctor J. A. Kinniburgh, principal, and J. Duval assistant, in the Baptist Church, Lafayette square.

The lower primary school, under the care of Mr. Bigot, principal and Riviere assistant, and the Central school under that of Messrs. Murray, principal, Pichot and Roca de Santi Petri, professors, continue, as heretofore, in the old Convent of Ursulines, Condé Street.
