**OUR WARRIOR'S OMBUDSMAN.**  
WASHINGTON, July 23, 1854.  
The opposition to the proposed bill in the Senate, yesterday, after a protracted session, was terminated by the passage of the bill, for the first time, by a vote of 27 yeas and 17 nays. **THE TREATY WITH JAPAN.**  
The following is the text of the treaty between the United States and the Empire of Japan, as signed at Washington, D. C., on the 29th day of March, 1854. The treaty is a landmark in the history of international relations, and its provisions are of great importance.

**ARTICLE I.**
