SUBJECT: (S) Transfer Recommendation for Guantanamo Detainee, Hezbollah Abd Jalil Andar, ISN: US9AF-000666DP

1. (S) **Personal Information:** Hezbollah Abd Jalil Andar is an Pakistani national born in 1984 (age 19) in Miram-Shah, Pakistan. Detainee has been diagnosed with latent tuberculosis but is otherwise in good health.
2. (FOUO) **Detention Information:** Subject detainee was cutting Alfalfa on his farm sometime in April 2002 when Coalition forces appeared in his village, searching the area. Detainee was watching the soldiers' activities when one of them asked him if he knew Saifullah Rakhman Mansoor. Detainee responded that he did and complied when asked to show the soldiers the way to Mansoor's house. Detainee and his cousin helped the soldiers move objects from the house, after it was searched, and load them on a truck. Once the soldiers were finished, they asked detainee and his cousin to accompany them. US Military Police arrived shortly after and detained the two. They were then transported to Gardez, where they underwent biographical data interrogations. The next morning they were flown to Bagram where they stayed for approximately 40 days undergoing two full interrogations. They were then transported to Kandahar for 20-25 days. Detainee was subsequently transported to Guantanamo Bay Naval Base, Cuba on 13 June 2002 because of his knowledge of the Taliban in Afghanistan. Detainee has been cooperative, but Joint Task Force Guantanamo considers the information obtained from and about him as neither valuable nor tactically exploitable. Detainee was given the Afghanistan identifier in his ISN since that is where he had been living since 1990 and detainee considered that his home. Detainee wishes to be repatriated back to his family in Afghanistan.
3. (S) **Assessment:** Based on information collected and available to Joint Task Force Guantanamo as of 18 April 2003, detainee ISN: US9AF-000666DP is assessed as being neither affiliated with al-Qaida nor a Taliban leader. Moreover, based on the detainee folder, the knowledgeability brief, and subsequent interrogations by JTF Guantanamo, the detainee has no further intelligence value to the United States and will not be seen for further intelligence purposes. Subject detainee has not expressed thoughts of violence or made



threats toward the U.S. or its allies during interrogations or in the course of his detention. Based on the above, detainee poses a low threat to the U.S., its interests, or its allies.

4. (S) **Recommendation:** In view of the foregoing, I recommend subject detainee be considered for release or transfer to the control of another government.
5. (C) **Coordination:** JTF Guantanamo notified the Criminal Investigative Task Force of this recommendation on 6 May 2003, who approved the detainee's transfer under a conditional release agreement on 22 May 2003.
