About the Author

Introduction

Sand is one of the most easily available resources to aid the early childhood learning process. It provides therapy for an upset child. It lends itself to group or lone activity. It can be piled, shaped, scraped, dumped, poked, measured, and sifted. Children learn new vocabulary and apply descriptive phrases to the activity being played out in the sand. As such, the sandbox should be an integral part of the play area.

It takes such a long time to set up centers in the early childhood centers. The purpose of this book is to provide activities for one of the centers so the provider can spend planning time on the other centers. Since no two children are alike, and no two days are alike, the activity needs to be adapted to meet the needs of your children.

The activities are the creative endeavors of many childcare workers setting sand centers, and brainstorms from early childhood instructors providing workers with new ideas. This book is only a starting point because new ideas should be added. There are so many opportunities for enhancement. Once an idea is recorded, it becomes a permanent record.

One important facet of any sand program is the sand supply cupboard. If the resources are designated just for the sandbox and labeled for easy access, the center is much easier to set up.
