Eligibility

All of our scholarships require that the applicant, 1) be a college or graduate student; 2) be a Muslim; 3) be a permanent resident, or citizen of the U.S.; 4) demonstrate financial need; and 5) has filed the FAFSA for the applicable year. We strongly consider students who are pursuing a graduate or professional degree and students who have actively engaged in scholarship, leadership, and public service. However, everyone who meets criteria 1 - 5 is encouraged to apply.

Who We Are

Dollar-A-Day Scholarship Fund (DAD) is a 501(c)(3) tax-deductible U.S. based non-profit organization. As one of the first national Muslim scholarship funds in the country, it provides a gateway of resources for Muslim-American students.

What We Do

DAD provides 1) scholarships for higher education; 2) no-interest loan databases; 3) travel and lodging stipends for internships; and 4) professional development opportunities which include networking, a mentorship program, and workshops on leadership and career development.

Why We Started

Muslim-Americans are an integral part of local communities and American society. With approximately one out of every three Muslim-Americans in the college demographic, Muslim youth have the potential to shape the community in profoundly beneficial ways as they plan and develop their career paths. Although schools and numerous organizations provide

scholarships and development resources to intelligent and motivated students, it is more common to find students that are faced with an undue burden when paying for their education: expending the entirety of their parent's savings or borrowing interest-based loans. DAD was created to help students and their families so that our children have an opportunity to realize their full potential.

How We Do It

The cornerstone of the organization is the concept that individuals can support DAD's mission with as little as a dollar a day, or approximately \$30 per month, or \$365 per year. By raising just one dollar a day per donor at a time, DAD is taking part in a bold grassroots campaign that allows donors to easily share the responsibility of educating our future generation of Muslim leaders and professionals. Through the dollar a day model, not only is DAD able to raise more funds, it is also able to unite the community for a common goal - helping our youth in their academic and professional pursuits and advancing scholarship, leadership, and public service. This is further reflected in DAD's slogan, Investing in Our Future, Together.sm
